





Anti-Semitic Incidents: U.S. **Over the Last Decade** | 2009-2018
























ASSESSING ANTI-SEMITISM: HOW DO JEWS FEEL?



Nearly half

of the respondents worried about being subjected to anti-Semitic verbal insults or harassment (47%), and four in 10 worried about an anti-Semitic physical attack (40%).





In 2018 and 2019, there were **7,743** incidents of extremism or anti-Semitism in the United States.




