Olam Tikvah Assistant Rabbi Search - Take 2

Many things in 2020 were unexpected; carrying out a months-long search for an Assistant Rabbi and then not hiring an individual was one. With so many norms being challenged last March, we remain confident that we made the best decision for our *kehillah* at the time. We recognize how hard it would have been to integrate a leader and counselor of the community in the particular climate. That said our OT community has risen to the challenges brought by the pandemic and we have reentered the search process. We are eager to welcome a new Assistant Rabbi into our community this summer, to help teach, lead, learn from, engage with, and counsel our community.

Several of you are familiar with the search process, but others are not, so this is a chance to share the roadmap we will follow over the coming months.

OT participates in the joint placement process of the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism and the Rabbinical Assembly, which allows us to select from a pool of newly ordained rabbis from the Jewish Theological Seminary (JTS) in New York and Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies in Los Angeles.

The Search Committee will guide us through this vigorous and energizing process. Their responsibilities include preparing our application, designing and facilitating virtual site visits, participating in formal candidate interviews, discussing and evaluating community feedback and personal impressions, and making a hiring recommendation to the Board of Directors.

The Application

Completing the application requires us to deeply consider who we are and what kind of community we aspire to be. Therefore, the hiring process becomes an opportunity for self-assessment and evaluation of where we are on the paths we have chosen.

At the same time, we are able to consider our aspirations. In what ways do we want to grow our congregation? Is there a particular segment of the congregation that needs new or special attention? Is there an unserved population within (or outside of) OT? What communal challenges need to be addressed? Are there distinct elements that must be protected? And how do we imagine a new rabbi will help us achieve those goals?

Mirroring our community's response to the challenges brought on by COVID, we have submitted a statement on our measured and intentional approach to decision-making, as opposed to allowing the pandemic to be the defining message of our responses.

Olam Tikvah is a *kehillah k'doshah*—a sacred community—because we look simultaneously and profoundly into tradition, our contemporary experience, and our dreams for the future. This process helps us chart a course that draws us closer to a life of spiritual growth, supportive community, intellectual heights and joy, in a thoughtful and intentional fashion.

Search Committee Members

The Search Committee is chaired by Michelle Pearlstein, our 2nd Vice-President, and last year's committee has been reconvened to complete the search. Selected to represent a cross-section of the OT community, the Committee includes Jeff Borenstein, Judy Werbel, Arnold Golub, Naomi Saad, Walt Meyer, Sara Silverman, Brittanie Werbel (Past President), and Alan Gorowitz (President). Their bios are posted on the OT website.

Interview Week

Between February 8-11, Alan Gorowitz and Brittanie Werbel will participate with us in the first round of interviews. Dubbed "Interview Week," the four of us will interview all candidates who make the request in 50-minute Zoom sessions. Historically, these interviews were held in New York at JTS.

Virtual Site Visits

Based on the first round of interviews, we will extend invitations to candidates to "visit" OT between February 14 and March 22. In order to provide a level playing field to all synagogues and rabbis, the RA and USCJ have determined there will be no in person site visits this year. The Search Committee is working to re-imagine how to provide multiple opportunities for our members to engage with the candidates and make sure the candidates get a sense of who we are as a community.

Each candidate will also be provided opportunities to meet with selected members of the OT Board, professional staff, and the Search Committee, whose members will also manage the logistics of each visit.
