# From Rabbi Li-Paz

It's Impossible to Be a Jew... Alone.

Moving through the hot summer and toward the hopefully cooler months of autumn, my mind is on all that will happen in our lives in these coming seasons of our lives. While my thoughts, to-do lists and plans all center on events at the synagogue, I find myself coming to the same conclusion over and over again. I want to take this opportunity to share it with you.

It's impossible to be a Jew alone. That's why we invented the minyan, God's sacred presence conjured up when Jews come together in prayer. That's why it meant so much to you that so many people showed up for your daughter's Bat Mitzvah or your grandson's wedding, or that they went out of their way to pay a condolence call when you were sitting shiva. Judaism connects you to other people and that, according to what we know of God's wishes, is God's intention.

Now, if you buy into the idea that being a Jew is not a private matter but a matter of being a community, a people, there is something I want every one of you to do in the coming year. I want you to claim ownership of Valley Outreach Synagogue and Center for Jewish Life. It's your center for your Jewish life. I want you to see it as something that belongs to you, not something you belong to. A synagogue doesn't work, it can't give you what you need from it, if you see yourself as a customer: "Let's see what's happening at VOS and decide if it interests us." For your wellbeing more than ours, you have to see it as something that belongs to you. Find something we do that matters to you. If it doesn't currently exist, invent it. If it's not religious services, it could be one of our JEWELS childhood or adult classes. It could be the companionship and meaningful friendship of Sisterhood, Men's Club, Brotherhood or VOS Sisters. It could be partnering with teenagers, singing in our choir, acting in our next show, guiding the direction of our Religious School, or being part of the group that calls and visits the lonely and the shut-ins or delivers food to families sitting shiva. Do it for your sake, not for VOS's, because you understand that nobody can be a Jew alone.

#### RABBI-IN-RESIDENCE LECTURE SERIES



Our Rabbi-In-Residence Lecture Series continues this month and we are back with exciting and inspiring talks from some of America's finest rabbis! On Thursday, August 24th at 7:00 p.m. on Zoom we are privileged to host Rabbi

Joshua Garroway from Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion, who will speak to us on Jewish Identity: From Ancient to Modern Times. The question of "who is a Jew" can be complicated in today's world. Many people even describe themselves with terms like secular Jew, cultural Jew, Jew-ish, half-Jewish, Jewish adjacent, and more. The fuzzy boundaries around today's Jewish identity are hardly a new phenomenon, however, Ancient Jews dealt with nearly the same issues and concerns. Come and learn why Jewish identity has been so uniquely complicated for more than two millennia, and how that might shape the way you understand your own Jewishness!

Rabbi Garroway is the Sol and Arlene Bronstein Professor of Judaeo-Christian Studies at HUC-JIR. Raised in Rochester, New York, Rabbi Garroway earned his rabbinical ordination in 2003 and a PhD from Yale University in 2008. His scholarship has forged new directions in the study of Christian origins, particularly through his two books, Paul's Gentile-Jews: Neither Jew nor Gentile, But Both, and The Beginning of the Gospel: Paul, Philippi, and the Origins of Christianity. While his academic books and articles focus on the events of the first century, and specifically the life and writings of Paul, his teaching and popular writing deal with Jewish texts and history more broadly. He has lectured across the globe from California to New York, England, Italy, Slovakia and beyond. Rabbi Garroway teaches rabbinical students at the Hebrew Union College, and also undergraduate students at the University of Southern California through the Louchheim School of Judaic Studies.

Everyone is welcome to join us and you're sure to find it meaningful and enlightening. Mark your calendars for this empowering and thoughtful presentation. We look forward to seeing you for future Rabbi-In-Residence lectures when we bring you interesting rabbis to share their wisdom, knowledge and expertise.

This year August 2<sup>nd</sup> coincides with Tu B' Av (15 Av 5783). I see this holiday as a very welcome respite, a transition from Tisha B' Av which was last week on July 26<sup>th</sup> and 1 Elul. Tisha B'Av, the saddest day in the Jewish Calen-

dar is associated with many tragedies in our history. Most notable are the destruction of the first and second temples. On 1 Elu Friday, September 1st, we enter a period of accounting and preparation for the High Holy Days. However, during this time of serious soul work, we have the minor and joyous festival, Tu B' Av. In Israel, young women dress in white and go to dance in the fields, young men following them. One opinion equates this date with G-d's forgiveness for the sin of the spies. Tu B' Av can be celebrated by having a good time; picnicking, noticing the full spectrum of color in nature, rediscovering love between G-d and humans as well as love between people. I am reminded of the lyric "what the world needs now is love". It is so true.

It has not escaped my attention that there is great strife in the world, fires, wars, political protests in Israel, harsh weather events etc. The effect of these world crises on my own psyche as well as handling my personal mishigas are where and what I've been learning in our VOS Adult Ed classes help me to understand and process myriad issues. In **Mussar** class, I've learned to work on my middot/personality traits and behaviors to help tame my yetzer hara/ego and employ my yetzer ha tov/my higher self. Torah Inspired Learning with Rabbi Li-Paz helps me understand our religion, the basis of our beliefs and behaviors. I'm looking forward to learning Jewish History this year with Michael Raileanu. If we, humanity, could only learn to not repeat our mistakes from the past, perhaps we could achieve tikkum olam, repair the world.

Rosh Hodesh is an opportunity to bond and celebrate the new moon while connecting spiritually with other women. People of the Book Club is a wonderful way to share the experience of reading and discussing a good book.

The VOS Sunshine Committee is a wonderful group of VOS members who volunteer to contact VOS members in their time of need.


The Sunshine Committee members insure that our VOS family members are contacted by phone for well-being checks and encouragement.

10 per month. When we don't

So just shipping alone is close to \$200/month, and that's cold, hard cash. No discounts from the USPS even for sending to our military.

These men and women deserve our support, folks. Receiving the C-rats and other goodies we send really does help make their deployment a little easier. It also reminds them of home and family – where honestly they really would rather be.
