On the Basic Braid

Every Friday evening, I drink a good glass of wine and eat what is surely the most delicious form of bread, challah. I try to resist bread the rest of the week but on Friday evening, my religion demands that I enjoy the best of the best. Ciabatta is good. German dark bread is fine. A fresh slice of wheat toasted is delicious but challah, I think you'll agree, is just divine.


Our beloved Shabbat loaf is originally referenced in the bible as a small portion of dough torn off and set aside as a tithe for the priest. Therefore, even to this day, one important element of challah that makes it kosher is that the maker tears off a small piece, usually wraps it in foil, and burns it in the oven as a small sacrifice. Our Torah study students surely recognize this from our current reading of Leviticus.

But the braids? My research shows that beautification of the loaf has a surprising origin. The practice of braiding the challah loaf is thought to have begun in the 15th century - not in Israel...or even Challarado...but in Austria and Southern Germany. Jewish housewives started braiding their loaves following the local Christian tradition of plaiting loaves baked on Sundays. Who knew? The braids were also thought to symbolize the Sabbath bride's hair. The number of strands in the braid could reflect one's wealth and status; the more strands, the wealthier the family. Some say that the three traditional braids represent truth, peace, and justice. Round challahs, baked for Rosh Hashanah, symbolize continuity. Other shapes, like ladders or hands, have their own unique symbolism associated with different Jewish holidays or concepts.

But did that 15th century challah loaf taste as delicious as the one I ate last Friday evening? Not likely. That sweetness, the eggs, sugar, poppy seeds, raisins and even chocolate chips are all American additions.

An Unforgetable Small Act of Kindness

Something amazing happened to me today – really amazing!

Sharona Jacobs, Rabbi Li-Paz's Assistant, called me to let me know that she received a call from a former Marine named Daniel, who had received one of the C-Rat boxes (military term for Type C-Rations) in 2004 that was sponsored by VOS. Daniel received that box while serving in Iraq and wanted to thank the VOS volunteers who had signed the card that was included in every package.

I called Daniel and he told me that while talking to his son about his time in the Marines, he opened a box of mementos from those years. One of the things he found was the card from his C-Rats. He wanted to tell us how much it meant to him to get those small gifts during his deployment.


He told me the story of his determination to join the Marines after 9/11, at just 17 years old. Since he had a childhood bout with asthma, the Marines refused him repeatedly, even after several requests for an exception and being in perfect health. He called his representative, his senator, and finally he called the Office of the President. That call got him connected to the Pentagon. He explained to the person with whom he was speaking about all the hoops he had jumped through to try to enlist in the Marines. He was then instructed to go back to his recruiter and re-submit his application. That was the "golden ticket" as far as he was concerned. He got his wish to join the Marines, and served our country soon after.

I was so touched by his story and how compelled he felt to track me down after nearly two decades.

He wanted to be sure I knew how much he appreciated what VOS and our volunteers had done to make the lives of all the service members a little brighter.

More than 20 years later, the volunteers, local managers and VOS liaison

may have changed, but the need of our troops to receive small comforts from home remains the same.





Chanukah Angels







Rabbi-in-Residence Lecture Series



Our Rabbi-In-Residence Lecture
Series continues
this month with a special presentation from one of
America's finest
rabbis. On Thursday, February 15

at 7:00 p.m. on Zoom, we will feature Rabbi Marvin Hier, the Founder and Dean Emeritus of the Simon Wiesenthal Center (SWC) and its Museum of Tolerance, who will speak to us on "Hate Has Crossed the Ocean".

Named by *Newsweek* as number 8 among the 50 most influential rabbis in America, Rabbi Hier founded the Museum of Tolerance Jerusalem in 1993—now in its final stages of construction in Jerusalem. In this capacity, Rabbi Hier and his senior team have raised hundreds of millions of dollars for the institutions he has supervised and directed.

Rabbi Hier founded Moriah Films, the SWC's film division, in 1980, has served as Moriah Films' executive producer, and holds the distinction of being the only Rabbi who is a member of the Academy of Motion Pictures Arts and Sciences, and the recipient of two Academy Awards. His personal relationships with many of Hollywood's industry leaders

has resulted in 40 years of National Tribute Dinners, which have raised hundreds of millions of dollars for the SWC.

Rabbi Hier was the first Orthodox rabbi in American history to be invited to deliver an invocation of a Presidential inauguration, and the first American to be chosen by the government of Israel to light the Torch of Remembrance on Israel's Independence Day. He is also a recipient of two honorary Ph.D's.

Since its creation in 1977, Rabbi Hier has directed and implemented, together with senior colleagues, all the goals, policies, and programs, including the worldwide social action activities of the SWC. Rabbi Hier was recently invited to join The Genesis Prize Foundation Advisory Board. The Genesis Prize, which is often referred to as the Jewish Nobel, annually awards \$1 million to Jewish people who have attained recognition and excellence in their fields.



Celina Karp Biniaz was just eight years old when Germans invaded her homeland of Poland in 1939. Over the next six years, the child from Krakow endured the Holocaust as the Nazis took away her schooling and civil rights, then herded her and her family into a ghetto. Life grew worse when the ghetto was liquidated, and the family was sent to Plaszow, a slave labor/concentration camp where they lived in constant fear, witnessing unspeakable horrors.

Ultimately, Celina and her parents landed on Oskar Schindler's list, but before being sent to safety at Schindler's factory, Celina spent several terrifying weeks at Auschwitz where she faced down the infamous Dr. Josef Mengele.

Did You Know...?

In modern times, February 14, Valentine's Day, is celebrated in many countries as a way to express love to one another. In ancient Rome, the festival called Lupercalia was celebrated in February at the start of spring, and was believed to bring fertility to people.

The origin of Saint Valentine's Day is one of several different legends. One legend suggests that Christians created Saint Valentine's Day in February to counteract Lupercalia, and commemorate a man named Valentine, who, according to legend, was jailed in a Roman prison for attempting to help Christians escape prison. Before he was put to death, he wrote a letter to a young woman, with whom he had fallen in love, and signed it "from your Valentine." Additionally, in the Middle Ages, February 14 was celebrated as the start of the mating season for birds.

All of those legends aside, did you know that February 14, 2006 is a significant date in Jewish American History?

Between 1981 and 1990 each year, Congress passed public laws designating a week in either April or May as Jewish Heritage Week. On April 24, 1980, President Carter issued the first proclamation for Jewish Heritage Week. Every President since then followed with similar proclamations.

Then on **February 14**, **2006**, Congress issued H.R. Con. Res. 315 which stated:

Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate concurring), That Congress urges the President to issue each year a proclamation calling on State and local governments and the people of the United States to observe an American Jewish History Month with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities.

Agreed to February 14, 2006.



The first proclamation designating May as Jewish American Heritage Month was issued by President Bush on April 20, 2006. Presidents George W. Bush, Obama, Trump, and Biden have all issued proclamations since then for Jewish American Heritage Month. In his first proclamation on April 24, 1980, President Carter wrote:

"Ever since the first Dutch Jew set foot in New Amsterdam in 1654, Jews have been contributing bountifully to the culture and history of our country. Indeed, the history of the Jewish people in America goes all the way back to the Jewish scientists and mariners who helped Columbus reach the New World. Later, Jews took an active part in the War of Independence, in the settlement of the West, and in the dynamic expansion of American technology. In medicine, education, trade, the law, politics, the labor movement, religion, motion pictures, athletics, literature, and more, the Jewish people have richly endowed America and the American way of life. American Jews have made their heritage—a heritage of struggle for freedom, knowledge, and human dignity—part of the inheritance of all Americans."

February 14 may generally be celebrated as Valentine's Day, but now you know that date's importance in Jewish American history and heritage.
