From Rabbi Li-Paz

July begins one of the cycles of our year. It's the New Year for synagogue membership. While I clearly hope that you will be continuing your membership in the VOS family, I want to suggest that you consider how you might make this New Year extraordinary and memorable.

Audience experiences are wonderful but as a performer and participant for many years of my working life, I want to tell you that there is nothing like taking part in the story itself. At VOS, that story is one of rich personal relationships, yes, shared sorrows and shared joys, volunteerism, lifelong learning, and most profoundly, a strong sense of purpose.

Most good literature on happiness, good health and longevity comes to the same conclusion: It won't be our vitamin and mineral supplements that ensure the quality and length of our days. It will be our connection to purpose at any age.

Harvard's longest running longitudinal study on health and longevity concluded that community was the most important factor in positive outcomes.

A multitude of current study results from sources across the globe conclude that people (of all ages) who regularly attend religious services live longer and healthier lives. It's a stunning finding. My assumption is that people who are involved in religion are inherently connected to hope. Why pray if you don't have hope? Religious affiliation and involvement offers a tight-knit community, multiple sources of support, compassion, perspective, and a connection to purpose-driven living.

In case all of my thoughts here seem to be geared only to older people, I want to suggest that we who are parents of younger adults or children, reread this article and reconsider these ideas as they relate directly to our children and grandchildren. VOS and Judaism offer connection (life's greatest safety net), a strong sense of accountability, faith in a better future, fun, spiritual growth, friendship, belonging, inspiration and yes, valuably, a clear sense of moral clarity, one of life's great tools.

If you would like to sit down with me to discuss how you and your family might further immerse yourselves in VOS life this year, I would welcome the chance to chat.

In the meantime, I respectfully ask that you don't wait until the High Holy Days to renew or join VOS. Please support us with your membership today.

CELEBRATING ROSH HODESH at VOS
The Woman's Holiday

Rosh Hodesh, when only a sliver of the new moon is visible in the sky, marks the beginning of each month in the Jewish lunar calendar. Think

Rosh Hashanah, the New Year, which begins on Rosh Hodesh Tishrei. Tradition tells us that G-d gave the holiday exclusively to women as a reward for not contributing their jewelry to the building of the Golden Calf at Mt. Sinai. Kabbalistic teachings recognize the special relationship between women and the moon. According to the Talmud, it is a day when women abstain from some forms of work.

As women have celebrated over the centuries, so too do women participate worldwide today, including our own VOS members. Our group employs some contemporary ritual and creative practices, always looking to the calendar for themes. We draw from a variety of resources, use journaling, art projects and discussion. Each meeting is unique, building upon the relationships we are cultivating with one another and our Jewish heritage. Examples of some of our activities have included painting our own Miriam cups, decorating our own timbrels, and having a Tu B'Shevat Seder.

As we begin our third year, we are inviting more women to join us so that you too can experience this beautiful ancient tradition. We usually meet in the evening on the fourth Monday of the secular month.

The VOS Sunshine Committee is a wonderful group of VOS members who volunteer to contact VOS members in their time of need.


The Sunshine Committee members insure that our VOS family members are contacted by phone for well-being checks and encouragement.






