From Rabbi Li-Paz


There is no doubt that when we arrive at the holiday of Purim this year on the eve of March 23, rabbis will liken the villainous leaders of Hamas to the villain of our Megillah, Haman. They won't be incorrect. The likeness bears noting. Like at Passover when we acknowledge that in every age tyrants have risen against us, Purim tells us that there are those evil ones in the world - individuals and regimes embodying evil but it also goes on to show us that evil can be vanquished. Haman is not the hero of the story. The scroll does not conclude with his ascendance to great power. He and his followers are, in fact, defeated and put to death. The heroes are the courageous Jewish cousins Esther and Mordechai, and an unlikely, but notable, hero is King Achashverosh. Why do I count him among the heroes? He sees light, recognizes truth, rewards goodness and ultimately destroys evil.

Yes, certainly there have been villains out to end our religious practices and even to end our lives but there have always been good people – friends, allies who have risen to our defense, stood with us in solidarity and even put themselves at risk on our behalf.

In today's world, we see parallels in the global struggle against tyranny and oppression. Just as Esther and Mordechai found an unlikely ally in King Achashverosh, we find allies among nations and leaders who, despite their diverse backgrounds and interests, stand with us in our fight for freedom from violence and justice. Take some time to examine Germany's role in support of Israel in the current crisis or look at the votes in our Congress to see what American allyship means. Listen to the speeches of the leaders of Australia and India and most remarkably, the statements delivered by senior leaders of the United Arab Emirates. The international coalitions formed in response to aggression, the global movements for human rights, and the individuals who speak out against injustice, even at great personal risk, are modern-day Esthers and Mordechais. They remind us that courage and solidarity can transcend boundaries and that, together, we can overcome the Hamans of our time.

Did You Know...?

This March brings us the joy of Purim celebrations with hamantaschen to eat, groggers to twirl, costumes to don and the Megillah to read, reminding us of the bravery of Esther and Mordechai. Before that celebration commences. you also may run in to shamrocks, leprechauns, and all manner of green food and drink as those of Irish decent (and retailers) celebrate St. Patrick's Day. The recorded story of St. Patrick's life is one with many variations. Interestingly, the one fact that seems to be agreed upon by historians and scholars alike, is that St. Patrick was not Irish. It is theorized that Patrick could have been Welsh, Scottish, Roman, Italian, French, and yes, even Jewish.

Historians tell us that Patrick was born Maewyn Succat, but that name along with his birthplace is still disputed. Some say he was born in the Northern Kingdom of Strathclyde and his descendants were Roman-British. Others claim that he was born south of Wales, or in the city of St. Davids. In his own writing, Patrick describes himself as a Britton—a name once used by Celtic inhabitants in Britain and southern Scotland. It is generally agreed that he was born in the late 4th century and his father was a deacon.

Patrick's story begins at age 16, when he was captured and taken to Ireland by Irish pirates, and sold in to slavery. Held captive and forced to work as a shepherd, he eventually escaped around age twenty-two, to return home. He had a renewed faith in G-d after that experience, became a missionary, and decided to return to Ireland to bring Christianity to the then Pagan Irish. Legend says he is *the one* who brought Christianity to Ireland. In an article on history.com, February 22, 2023, author Jennie Cohen writes that Patrick likely wasn't the only missionary, noting that:

"In 431, before Patrick began preaching in Ireland, Pope Celestine reportedly sent a bishop known as Palladius 'to the Irish believing in Christ'—an indication that some residents of the Emerald Isle had already converted by then. One theory holds that the St. Patrick of lore is actually an amalgam of two men: Palladius and the deacon's son who first visited Ireland as an enslaved man."

Scholar Robert Heider goes so far as to make a connection that St. Patrick

was a Jew. His source is *The Book of Leinster* (1160), a mid evil Irish book of history and language, written in the 12th century and kept at Trinity College in Dublin. A quote from the translated book says:

"Patrick may have been descended from the Sons of Israel. When the Sons of Israel were banished by Titus and Vespasian into slavery to the four corners of the world in revenge for the blood of Christ, his ancestors came to Britain."

The Book of Lismore from the late 15th century has a similar passage noted by Heider. Many books have been written about St. Patrick. The Story of Saint Patrick (1895) by Joseph Sanderson, tells yet another version of Patrick's life and lineage. With all these varied accounts, the lines become blurred between fact and fiction, and between what is a story and what is historical.

This brings us to March 17, widely agreed upon as the day Patrick died. His official sainthood is questionable, as he was not canonized (given sainthood), at the time of his death because in the 5th century the church had no formal process to do that. Patrick was likely

given the status of patron saint of Ireland out of popularity through the stories shared about the myths and miracles that surrounded him. Who can't get behind a heroic story of Patrick having the power to drive out all the snakes from Ireland?

Perhaps this story is more symbolic of Patrick driving out Paganism that existed in ancient Irish practices. In actuality, due to climate and location, snakes were never native to Ireland.

On the botanical side of Patrick's story is the "shamrock", a term that comes from the Gaelic word seamrog, meaning "little clover." However, the plant we know as the "shamrock" is Oxalis (wood sorrel), which has a similar threeleaf structure to the clover, but is not a clover at all. It is said that Patrick used the three leaf "shamrock" to explain the holy trinity. That is another disputed claim, but people liked the allegory. The shamrock went on to become a symbol of pride in Ireland, representing the land that was taken from the Irish.

First recognized in 1631, St. Patrick's Day in Ireland was a religious holy day. It was in 1737 that the first St. Patrick's Day celebration was recorded in the America,

in Boston, with a gathering of the Members of the Charitable Irish Society, set up to help Irish immigrants.

As Irish and
Jewish immigrant
populations settled near
each other in American

cities, both groups shared a common history—they endured oppression in their native land and faced discrimination in America. Due to the expense of beef in Ireland, most Irish ate pork, not beef. Once in America, corned beef, sold by Jewish butchers, was cheaper (as was cabbage) and the Irish adopted it as a staple on their tables. Jewish and Irish immigrants also collaborated with each other as musicians, joined by their mutual love of singing and dancing, on Tin Pan Alley and in vaudeville shows. For example, in 1912 Jean Schwartz composed the music for the song "If It Wasn't for the Irish and the Jews," and William Jerome (who changed his name from Flannery to fit in with Jewish performers) wrote the song's lyrics.

"Talk about a combination, heed my words and make a note On St. Patrick's Day Rosinsky pins a shamrock on his coat There's a sympathetic feeling between the Blooms and McAdoos Why Tammany would surely fall, there'd really be no Hall at all If it wasn't for the Irish and the Jews"

What about St. Patrick being from Jewish descendants? That is an interesting theory depending on your sources. There is however, a clear connection between Jews and Irish when it comes to food. A March 17, 2016 on line Jewish Federation article "Do Jews 'Erin Go Bragh?" notes that:

"In the early 1960s, Irish Jews in New York formed the Loyal League of the Yiddish Sons of Erin, a group that met monthly. Their biggest event each year was their Erev St. Patrick's Day Banquet, in which attendees ate, among other things, corned beef, green matzo balls and green bagels!"

The history of St. Patrick's Day is yet another reminder of our commonality across cultures, and how legends, myths, and stories bring us together. So grab your friends, family, and bagels O'Schmear, and ask Alexa to play "If It Wasn't for the Irish and the Jews."
