#### Caring for our Bereaved Marshall Folk

There are many ways for members to become involved in supporting our Beth Sholom family. For me, one very special honor is that I participate as a member of the Beth Sholom Shiva Leader Team. I have had the privilege of being a shiva leader for the past 20 years and consider it one of the more important activities in which I have been involved as a longstanding and active member.

I remember back many years ago, before I knew how to lead prayer services, I needed someone to lead services when my mother passed away. It was a very sensitive and emotional time for me. I felt supported and cared for when members of my community stepped up and provided this deeply important service.

Beth Sholom is blessed with so many member families that it is not possible for the rabbi and the cantor to lead every shiva of such a large congregation. This is where our Beth Sholom shiva leaders perform their mitzvahs. A shiva leader is typically a regular minyan attendee who is well versed in leading the weekday morning, afternoon, and evening services. When a shiva is taking place, usually in our members' homes, a person who knows how to daven and to lead a group of people in prayer is needed twice every day lasting the entire shiva.

The team of 17 volunteer shiva leaders performs great mitzvahs, not only for the family in mourning, but also for ourselves. It is extremely meaningful and a great honor for me to lead services for a bereaved family at their house of shiva, each and every time that I have been requested to help.

I encourage mourners to continue saying Kaddish after the end of shiva, for the full duration needed. I invite them to meet me at synagogue so can continue supporting them in prayer, so they have someone to stand with and to be with. For this they always thank me as they now have a connection when they first come to the synagogue to say kaddish.

Many mourners have become regular attendees at our daily services

so that they too can support others saying Kaddish. It is a wonderfully supportive group, with great camaraderie (the morning breakfast is pretty great too)!

While hope you wil never have the need for a shiva leader, you should know this volunteer team is here for you.

## What is Yahrzeit?

Yahrzeit is the anniversary of the death of a dear one. It is observed each year on the Hebrew anniversary of the day of death.

The following observances are the traditional way to mark a Yahrzeit. A special 24-hour Yahrzeit candle should be kindled in the home on the eve of the anniversary of death and allowed to burn throughout the next day. Every effort should be made to say Kaddish in the synagogue on the evening and day of the Yahrzeit. Jewish tradition also encourages the performance of mitzvot on the day, such as studying a portion of the Torah; leading the davening at a service; and giving a donation in memory of the departed to a religious, educational, or philanthropic cause. This way we fulfill the traditional hope: "The memory of the righteous should serve as a blessing."

## What is Yizkor?

Yizkor is without a doubt, one of Judaism's most emotional rituals. In this moment we recall the memories of all the people we loved, those who gave us life and nurtured us, those with whom we shared time and love, and all of those who were family.

The word Yizkor is derived from the Hebrew word zachor, which means simply "to remember." On this day we remember all those who gave our lives the meaning and depth that make our lives what they are.

The history of Yizkor is fascinating. Many authorities are of the opinion that Yizkor began in earnest in the Middle Ages. As the Christian states of Europe expanded and grew, they looked to conquer Jerusalem and have it under Christian control. This became the foundation and reason behind the Crusades, which led many armies through Europe to wage battle for control of Israel and Jerusalem. Sadly, as the Crusaders made their way out of Europe to Israel they ran through many Jewish towns and villages. Countless numbers of Jews were raped, maimed, and murdered at the hands of these armies.

## **Yizkor Traditions**

The custom of reciting Yizkor during the four major Jewish Holy Days has a number of interesting connections. The first reason might be that the Holy Days were the few times of the year when nearly every Jew attended synagogue services at the same time. This collective union certainly gave thought to all those who were not there: thus the need to remember them.

The second reason given is that the major Jewish Holy Days also re-emphasize the great need for charity. It has been an ancient Jewish custom to see that every hungry person in town was in a home for mealtime, because no meal could be considered happy if even one person was left hungry. In our own times we dedicate charity and kindness to the memories of those we loved, because when we do, the feeling is that they are still very much alive.

While they are not alive in body, they are certainly alive in spirit and action. This is one of the reasons why the Talmud (Bavli, Ta'anit 5.2) teaches us that Jacob has never been thought of as dead. In our minds Jacob is still very much alive because his children carry on his legacy and spirit. We are those children, and his legacy is the Jewish nation.

Indeed, those scholars asked, "How can Ya'akov still be thought of as alive? Did he not die? Was he not put into a coffin? Was he not buried?" And in reply, the famous Rabbi Yochanan answered, "But we are still alive, aren't we ...?"

So too, remember today that your loved ones are alive. They live not only in your actions but also in your heart and soul. Truly, this is as close as anyone can ever be to you.

## Yizkor Message from Rabbi Flanzraich

"I spend time with people who are suffering. The kinds of suffering which are known to us all – illness, setbacks, strife and death. And I have also come to know beyond a compassionate word and a caring heart sometimes a small gesture of humour spoken in the right moment in the right way can bring extraordinary comfort to someone. And this is because in those moments when all seems lost to us; those moments of pain, heartache and loss we want to believe that as the sun which has set will yet again rise. This is not to say that everything will go back to the way it was but it is to say that some kind of return is possible. The person's visit, a smile, a small laugh opens the window for a crack of light to come to us.

Which if true is doubly true for death - above all else we need to know how to see again because death blinds us. It is for that reason we don't say Yizkor every day even though we feel its message every day.

That reason is to be found in a person we think we know very well after all he appears at some of the richest moments of our lives. He is at the Pesach seder and we pour a 5th cup of wine for his arrival. At a Brit Milah a chair is reserved specifically for him in order that he can witness another soul being brought into our ancient covenant.

The person is Eliyahu, Elijah the prophet. And the answer is at the end of his life

When his time to leave the earth was approaching he tries to tell his beloved disciple Elisha to let him go.

"Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here, for the Lord has sent me on to Bethel." "As the Lord lives and as you live," said Elisha, "I will not leave you." So they went down to Bethel.

Disciples of the prophets at Bethel came out to Elisha and said to him, "Do you know G-d will take your master away from you today?" He replied, "I know it, too; be silent."

Then Elijah said to him, "Elisha, stay here, for the Lord has sent me on to Jericho."

"As the Lord lives and as you live," said Elisha, "I will not leave you." So they went on to Jericho.

The disciples of the prophets who were at Jericho came over to Elisha and said to him, "Do you know that G-d will take your master away from

you today?" He replied, "I know it, too; be silent."

Elijah said to him, "Stay here, for the Lord has sent me on to the Jordan." "As the Lord lives and as you live, I will not leave you"

Elisha was not prepared to let go of his master who he considered to be not just his teacher, but his spiritual father. Pleadingly, finally Eliyahu says;

if you see me as I am being taken from you, it will be granted to you;

That if he lets go, if Elisha the student stays and watches his passing then not only would he be great, but that his greatness would surpass that of Eliyahu's. Which is exactly what Elisha ends up doing. And he finds greatness for himself. But the painful irony is we don't remember Elisha, or have a cup at the seder or a chair at a Brit. B we do for Eliyahu. And I wonder if it is because he was the one who taught Elisha how to face loss.

I think about this often.

Because these moments are filled with ambivalence. We try to comfort ourselves with knowing what has been left in their wake. A mother, father, spouse, child, friend. I won't lie to myself or to you - to those who have loved there is no ultimate comfort. Maybe at the best comfort is found in a strength to carry on. Elijah's lesson is meaningful to us but also imperfect: a loss suffered once is a loss suffered forever.

Judaism's faith is not only in the story of what we accomplish by our hands but even greater is the inspiration we give to the hands of those who come after us. For this reason we aren't reconciled with the deaths of those we love - our pain inspires us to build, grow, and continue to carry their lives forward. Not resigning ourselves to their passing is the pulse to this kind of life.

But perhaps it is the words of the poet Edna St. Vincent Millay which says it best of all:

I am not resigned to the shutting away of loving hearts in the hard ground.

So it is, and so it will be, for so it has been, time out of mind:

Into the darkness they go, the wise and the lovely. Crowned

With lilies and with laurel they go; but I am not resigned.

Down, down, down into the darkness of the grave Gently they go, the beautiful, the tender, the kind; Quietly they go, the intelligent, the witty, the brave. I know. But I do not approve. And I am not resigned."

Beth Sholom Synagogue supports the One More Candle project. The project's aim is to remember each of the 1.5 million children who perished in the Shoah; to remember that these children lived and laughed and were loved. Many have no one to remember they existed. The Beth Sholom community has, to date, adopted the memory of 47 children who perished in the Shoah, one for each day of the Hebrew calendar year (starting with Jan. 1, 1942 - corresponding to 12 Tevet), including both Adar I and II. These children were all 8 or 9 years old when they perished and are listed by their Hebrew date of death. The children ("") we remember are:

One who has not seen a Jewish person's grave within the last thirty days recites the following:

Blessed are You, Eternal, Who resuscitates the dead.

Who is like You, O Master of mighty deeds, and who is comparable to You, O Ruler, Who causes death and restores life and makes salvation sprout. And You are faithful to resuscitate the dead.

Upon reaching the grave, it is customary to place one's left hand on the monument and recite the following verses (from Isaiah 58:11,12):

### At One's Mother's Grave

Here is buried the body of my mother who sustained and nurtured me, and who endured much pain all her days to raise me, and all my needs were upon her. She led me in the path of Torah and fear of G-d. Alas, she has gone the way of all mortals. The mother of the children has fallen, she has left her children. For me, none like unto her is left, a compassionate leader always prepared to do good for me. Behold now that I am in difficult straits, I have come here. I went to the vale of tears, to the house of my mother, to the chamber of my parent. Behold she is garbed in a shroud, and her spirit has ascended above. Peace be unto her, and peace be unto her soul and spirit. "From amongst all the women in the tent is she blessed," and the glory of G-d should shine upon her. May Your mercy be aroused for me, G-d, my Rock, that You should hear the voice of my supplication.

Please, O Awesome and Holy One, forgive all of my sins and sustain me from Your heavens with produce, bread, and sustenance. Be not deaf to my tears. Redeem me from descending to the pit, and may I not lack my bread. Grant me the privilege to see children and grandchildren engaged in Torah, mitzvot, and fear of G-d. Upon my knees may three and four generations be born, people of valour who fear the L-rd.

### At One's Father's Grave

In the darkness of this grave rests the body of my father. All the treasures which were mine from days of yore are sunk here. The holy spirit of my dear father, who walked with integrity and uprightness before You, has soared into the eternal world. You shelter him under Your protective wings. Selah.

I pray, hearken unto the voice of my prayer and turn to good all the dreams that I dreamt for myself and those that my friends dreamt for me. Bestow upon me the priestly blessings. Fulfill all the desires of my heart for good in the merit of all the righteous, pious, and holy men and women who are buried here and who died to sanctify Your name, and in the merit of all righteous and pious people of the world. "May the expressions of my mouth and the thoughts of my heart find favour before You, Eternal, my Rock, and my Redeemer."

When placing one's hand on the monument, one should think of the verse "From you, the ancient ruins will be rebuilt," quoted above (Isa. 58:12), which contains fifteen Hebrew words, like the number of joints in the hand.
