A Message from Cantor Perper

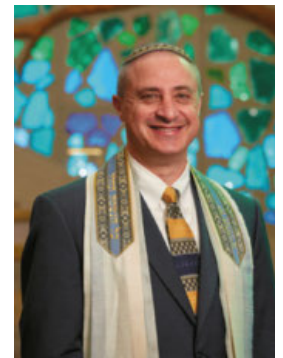
Dearest Shalom,

I have a few important programs to bring to your attention. To begin with is... **PURIM!!!** Not only will our Sunday religious school students experience our clergy and staff putting on a Taylor Swift Purim Spiel, but this year at our Adult Megillah reading, we will also be having a ton of fun with a group called ComedySportz doing some improv partially based on the Purim Story. Our Adult Megillah reading/ComedySportz will be on Saturday evening, March 23 at 6pm, unless, of course, you don't like to have fun!!

The second program, **Freedom Song**, is an original musical production created and performed by individuals who are current or past residents of Beit T'Shuvah, an interdenominational Jewish treatment program in Los Angeles. *Freedom Song* showcases a family celebrating a Passover Seder while also confronting the impact of addiction on the entire gathering. Interspersed are scenes from a 12-Step meeting, giving an inside look at the process of recovery. Following the performance, audience members are encouraged to ask questions of the cast, who courageously and honestly share their own stories of addiction and recovery. *Freedom Song* is an examination of the impact of addiction on a Jewish family and a celebration of the strength of the family to accept challenges and overcome shame and fear. This program promises to be spiritually meaningful, as well as an impactful lesson as it applies to Passover and the exodus. *Freedom Song* will be performed at Shalom on Thursday, April 4 from 6-8 pm. More details to follow in the weeks to come.

The third program coming your way is a 4-session class on the **History of Jewish Music**. I will be joined by my wife and master teacher, Cantor Faith Steinsnyder. We will delve into our sacred music's development through the ages, and we'll do some singing as well. Come to as many classes as you can. Each class will be 1 hour in length, 6:30-7:30pm, on the following dates, March 26, April 2, 9, and 16. Registration is required, so we know how many materials to prepare. Welcome to Our New Executive Director, Ryan Poolay

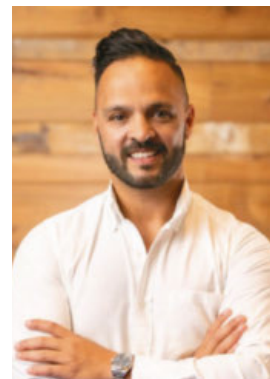
Shalom Congregants and Friends, please join us in welcoming Congregation Shalom's new Executive Director, Ryan Poolay!

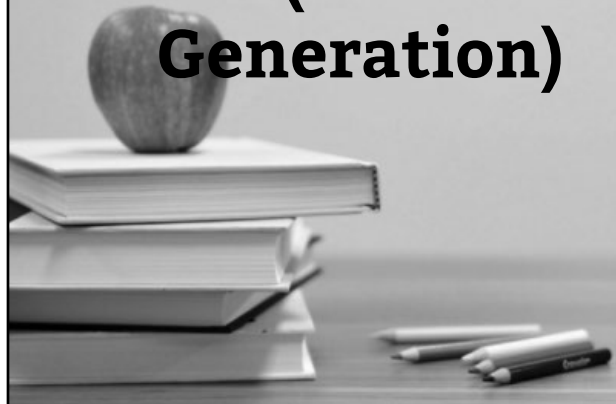

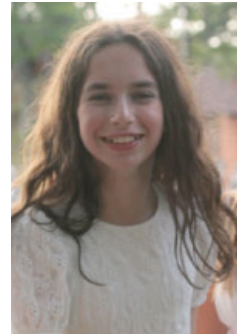

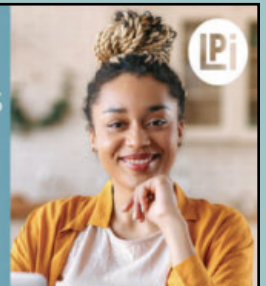
