A Message from Rabbi Noah



As I write this article, the movie Dune 2 has hit the big screen. Dune is one of my favorite books. I have read and reread the book over the years. In fact, I read the whole series. One concept from the book that was shown in the movie was the potential to dig into memory. Memory that transcends one's own lived experience and has been passed along the generations. In the book the main characters can access memories of all the people who came before them. I can only imagine what type of vision of life this might present the keeper of these memories. The times of beauty and the times of blight. Seeing it all and absorbing the wisdom of all that collective memory to bring to bear on the future.

Though we as individuals may not access every memory of the people who lived before us, our Jewish peoplehood has, in essence, a collective memory. Through passed stories, customs, history we can peer into the minds of our ancestors through a process known as Zachor Memory. This concept was written about by my Professor Yosef Yerushalmi of blessed memory in his book by that title, 'Zachor'. We can read of our ancestors' hopes, dreams and nightmares. We can read of the moments of beauty and the moments of degradation. We can learn of their debates about how to live and build a future. And we can learn about the way they perceived their past. This collective memory has few better examples than the Pesach Seder.

During the seder, the older generations set the scene with food and symbol to prompt the questions of the younger generation. When we answer those questions, we use I statements. For example, "For what the Eternal did for me when I was a slave in Egypt." We do this because we feel those memories. They are a part of us. Part of our memory. That is what Zachor means.

Our people have been on a long road of history. Among the longest. We have seen empires rise and fall and we have handed the wisdom and learning of generations to the next generations. By digging into the past. By experiencing what it means to pass through slavery to freedom. By remembering the long roads of powerlessness in foreign and hostile lands and always ending the seder with the words of hope, "next year in Jerusalem." Through all these experiences we learn what it is to be a people.

This year's seder will be different. While the seder may have the familiar words that the generations have spoken, year after year, this year we will be looking with questioning hearts to our present and our future. It will be a time of difficult reflection. There are empty seats at our collective table this year. Hostages we yearn for. There are questions of empathy. A lessening of our cup of joy for innocent civilians on both sides of the conflict. There are questions of anger, collective judgment, and too many tears. I ask you to dive into the discomfort, bringing forward the combined wisdom and memories of our ancient people. But the most important thing I ask you as you taste the salty tears of slavery, do not give up hope. For if we Zachor, if we truly remember then we know that hope is the one commodity that has never slipped from our collective hands. Zissen Pesach.
