

ROSH HASHANAH: FIRST DAY

Rosh HaShanah Evening

September 18, 6:00 pm / On Zoom

Please join us for a brief 60 minute service. We will conclude by lighting candles, making *Kiddush*, eating apples and honey, and doing *motzi* together before your festive meal!

Rosh HaShanah Morning

September 19, 10:00 am / On Zoom

This service is designed for adults and young people of *bar/bat mitzvah* age or older. This service will be abbreviated compared to past *Rosh HaShanah* morning services, running approximately 90 minutes.

Rosh Hashanah Family Service

September 19, 12:00 pm / On Zoom

This service is designed for families with children in grades K-7. It will run approximately 45 minutes.

Tashlich and Shofar Blowing

**September 19, 12:30 pm and 2:00 pm
Outdoors at the Demarest Duck Pond**

- *Tashlich* is the tradition of symbolically casting away one's sins into a body of flowing water. We will gather together at a safe social distance while wearing masks. At the same time, we will have the opportunity to hear the *shofar* blown in person.
- Two opportunities are available to engage in this tradition on the First Day of *Rosh Hashanah* (at 12:30 pm and 2:00 pm) and one for families with children in grades K-5 on the Second Day, as part of the *Rosh HaShanah* Outdoor Family Experience.

- Families with children pre-school age or younger should refrain from bringing them unless they are sure that their children will/can adhere to social distancing guidelines.
- There will be no *oneg/kiddush*.
- Everyone must sign a COVID-19 waiver, provided to those who RSVP.

Rosh HaShanah Second Day Service

September 20, 10:00 am / On Zoom

- This service, designed for adults and young people of *bar/bat mitzvah* age or older, will include the full *Rosh HaShanah* morning liturgy, akin to what has been done on the first day of *Rosh HaShanah* in previous years. The service will run approximately two and a half hours.
- There will be no musical service at this time due to the limitations of social distancing.
