At this time of the year in both America and Israel, we are struggling with the heat as the temperatures are rising higher and higher. In Chassidic thought, the heat of the Hebrew months of Tamuz and Av has a significant meaning, representing strong and powerful energy. Sometimes, we do not have the ability to handle these powers, and the result might be harmful. This is how the destruction of the Temple, which we commemorate at this time, is being explained. The thought is the Jewish people could not stand the light and holiness of the Temple. Similar explanation was given to the Sin of the Spies, which the Talmud tells us that happened in Tisha B'av. According to this view, the spies refused to enter Israel because they were afraid they will not be able to handle the demands of this holy place.

What we can take from it is that our goal at this time of the year is to think about our own sources of energy, and how to handle the power and light given to us by G-d. We can think of our own 'temple' which is not built, and about situations in life where we do not use the opportunities given to us by God. Let's use this time of the year, not only to hide in the air conditioning, but to think of all the heat and energy we got, and use it to uplift out lives.

At Camp Simcha and Camp Simcha Special, children and teens trade hospital rooms and doctors' offices for fun, friendship, and hope for the future. Campers enjoy traditional camp activities in fully handicapped-accessible facilities. Talent shows, concerts, and helicopter, hot-air, and motorcycle rides make every day super-special. Campers return home reinvigorated, with deep friendships and happy memories to help them travel the rough road ahead.

Rabbi Ari's first summer at camp was 1997 and he has served as Head Boys Counselor since 2001. The Camp Simcha website states "If Camp Simcha is a fairy tale for sick children, then Ari Dembitzer is it's Pied Piper."
