We are now in the Hebrew month called “Kislev.” This means that the holy holiday of Chanukah is approaching. Chanukah is about us being able to light up the darkness of winter and exile with true light. The best way to dim the effect of sunlight in a room is to turn on the fluorescent light in the room. Greek philosophy and Hellenism, as well as a compromised Judaism, is the fluorescent light. When we exchange the passion of living Torah and authentic Judaism with an external Judaism, we dim that light. The mission of our holy shul is to focus on the sunlight and not be content with the artificial light. We need to deepen that flame that brightens the world, together.

At this time of year, the days are shorter and the nights are longer. The Talmud (Eruvin 65a) brings an interesting discussion about how to use the long nights. Rav Yehuda said, “Night was created only for sleep.” Rabbi Shimon ben Lakish said, “The moon was created only for Torah study by its light.”

It might be seen as a practical argument about what to do at night – to sleep or to learn Torah. However, a deeper look will reveal the connection between these two opinions. Just as sleeping is a way for our physical body to fill its sources of energy after a long day, so does Torah learning, in regard to our spiritual energy.

After a tiring day, facing the long night, we obviously are looking forward to have some rest. However, we should not forget our spiritual needs also. Our soul is waiting to fill up, just like our physical body, and the Torah learning is our way to satisfy its needs.

Thankfully, we can find many ways to learn Torah around us: we can join a class at the shul, set up an individual learning with one of the rabbis, and even find a long-distance learning partner through Partners in Torah (look for it on Facebook or at www.partnersintorah.org).

May we have a meaningful winter!
