This month we end the book of "Breishit" and start the Book of "Shemot", as the Jewish people go down to Egypt, and become a nation. We then are brought out of Egypt and apply all the hard lessons learned there to building our nation in Israel. This year, on January 21th, we will be celebrating Tu B'Shevat, the New Year for the Trees. Halachically, this day is the cut-off point for tithing fruits, which requires counting the age of the tree and its fruits. The Talmud explains that by Tu B'Shevat, most of the winter's rain has fallen (in Israel), and this is the time when starts the process of Chanata - the beginning phase of the fruit's development, which occurs shortly after the tree's blossoming.

When looking at the trees in Israel on Tu B'Shevat, there is nothing to see. The flowers are mostly gone, and there are no fruits yet. So, why are we celebrating?

Tu B'Shevat is the holiday of the process. We recognize that not only achievements should be celebrated, not only the fruits, but also the process that leads to them. The early stages, when there is nothing to see, we know that deep inside of us something good is happening. The fruits are in the making – the Chanata – this is when we need to celebrate the most, to be happy for being part of a process of growth.
