

This year, we have the opportunity to be double happy because it's a leap year and we celebrate two "Adars". However, it seems odd to tell people to be happy, or be double happy. Either we are happy or we aren't. The rabbis tell us that the key to joy in Judaism is knowledge and connection. If we learn and understand why we do what we do, we will be happy doing it. On Purim, we reaccepted the Torah joyously, because we identify with it and because we engage in it. We have a lot happening at Beth Israel in the next few weeks. Purim, we dance. Dreamland, we give... be a part. However, what makes us unique, are the opportunities to learn and deepen our ways. We have a Sunday morning series this month called "Living authentically Jewish in the 21st century, which addresses vegetarianism, non-orthodox movement, and charity. We also have a daily five - minute class in which we will finish the books of the prophets and writings in less than two years for just five minutes daily! Look out for all the excitement on Facebook and different literature. Our shul is vibrant and growing, be a part!

Happy Adar Rabbi Ari

In this month we will celebrate Purim, on the 14th day of the second Adar. The Talmud explains that Purim is being celebrated on the second Adar and not on the first, because we want to celebrate Purim on the month that is the closest to Passover, and to attach the miracle of Purim to the miracle of Passover. What does that mean? What it the connection between Passover and Purim?

Passover and Purim are two opposites. In Passover we celebrate the open miracles that happened in Egypt. In Purim the miracles are hidden, and we recognize and celebrate the miraculous events which led to the saving of the Jewish people. In the Torah, Nisan is the first month, and Passover is the first holiday, and so Purim is the last holiday. During the year, we grow and learn how to recognize the miracles hidden in nature, and how to find godliness in the world. Our journey is to move from Passover to Purim, to build deep and strong faith, which does not need open miracles in order to believe, and that is able to see godliness in every step in life.


