#### **RABBI'S RESPONSA**



Shalom All.

I was with a marvelous older adult this afternoon who has recently enrolled in the services provided by hospice. She and I were discussing how curious it is that Judaism, which held little direct interest for her during most of her life, has grown enormously in its personal meaning as she approaches her final days on earth. We discussed why that might be and arrived at the conclusion that our traditions become most meaningful when they answer a specific need in our lives for which we lack other tools to address. She was an accomplished professional and in absolute control of her life along

the way but, now that she has been swept along as a participant (almost an observer!) in the next steps, she is finding the traditions of our people are providing meaningful direction.

I assured her that this was common in my experience. Many people find that the uncertainties of the end of life (our own or that of loved ones) leave us unbalanced and finding Judaism's guiding light proves valuable. I know, for a fact, that a great many atheists and agnostics, as well as life-long believers, have found comfort in our rituals. There is no inconsistency here. We do not need to set aside other beliefs in order to avail ourselves of the value of the death, burial and mourning rituals of our people.

I've also had many folks sheepishly admit that they don't feel they know anything about our rituals. They've heard that Judaism really knows how to "do death," but they do not necessarily know what that means or looks like. For that reason, I'm planning to offer two different series of classes this year that will speak to this. Both will be appropriate for older adults and those facing their own mortality as well as those who are (or will be someday) walking through it with someone.

The first series will be focused on our traditions. We'll discuss the à la carte menu of options

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Vesusvius erupted in 79 AD. Amidst the rubble in Pompeii, the remains of an inscription on a bakery were found stating: *Hic habitat felicitas* — "Here dwells happiness." We humans have been in search of happiness since the beginning of time. Imagine the aroma of fresh baked breads inspiring smiles as folks communed in the bakery awaiting their daily bread. Nearly 2000 years later, as rates of depression and mental illness soar, our search for the ever-elusive happiness continues. How can Temple Sinai play a role in your happiness?

I have written many times about the importance of

that will be available. We will cover everything from what to do and say ahead of death to whom you call first upon the news of death and what to expect at every step. We'll walk through it and practice for when it is time. We will look at materials that will help you prepare, no matter what your role will be, for anticipatory mourning, the funeral, shiva and beyond. This is both basic Judaism 101 and also deep contemplation of what this powerful time of life can offer everyone involved patient, caregivers and family.

The second series will be a course first offered at Sinai many years ago in which we undertook the process of developing our own Ethical Wills. Traditional Wills articulate who gets what when we die. Living Wills dictate our wishes for our own medical care as we approach the end (and we'll go over these, too). But, Ethical Wills are a careful and deliberate compilation of our personal, accumulated wisdom. You are a marvelous example of living Torah and it would be a shame if all of that Divine (and hard-earned) wisdom were

to simply go to the grave with you. What would you want your kids or grandkids to receive from you as a lasting legacy of your guidance? What would your partner or best friend benefit from reading after you are gone? Together, we'll explore the tradition of Ethical Wills, the traditional format and modern options for their creation (particularly in a digital age like this) and then we'll roll up our sleeves and write our first drafts of these precious documents.

Watch for the course announcements in the upcoming Scroll of Living and in our publicity this coming year. And, as always, if you have personal details to discuss on any of this, Cantor Micah and I remain available to you, always.

relationships in the cultivation of happiness. The longest running study on happiness, administered by Harvard University, started in 1938. It ran for 80 years, as they tracked the physical and mental health of 268 then sophomores. The findings were simple, "close relationships, more than money or fame... keep people happy throughout their lives.' Close relationships can mean many things: a spouse, one's family and one's community. The relationships that brought happiness centered around love, care and equality. Subsequent studies on happiness found that faith and meaningful work, in addition to close relationships, are also key components to happiness.

At Temple Sinai, we create pathways to relationships. Sinai Circles forge intentional relationships within the Temple Sinai family amongst members who might not have an opportunity to meet otherwise. These intimate groups create safe spaces, enabling our members to connect deeply. Another program I'm particularly excited about is Wine and Cheese and the Meaning of Life, beginning this summer. 10-12 people will engage in meaningful, thought-provoking conversation, facilitated by Rabbi Jay, while enjoying tasty

beverages and snacks. Staying Connected, programming for our seniors, is up and running again after the pandemic hiatus. *Yoav*, our Israeli emissary, will be leading a discussion group about Israel. We're also planning a panel discussion, a movie night, and a trip to the New York Botanical Gardens. We're excited to host more geographical gettogethers – within the last two years we've had tremendously successful gatherings of our members from Darien and New Canaan. Keep an eye out for gatherings in Stamford, Greenwich and Pound Ridge.

Temple Sinai is a *Kehillah Kedoshah* thanks to the sacred relationships that form here. As a current Circle member reflected, God exists in the connections between the people here at Sinai. It is our sincerest hope that, within this community, our members can be their most authentic selves, thus finding connection, meaning and happiness. The Pompeiin baker would surely smile seeing "Hic habitat felicitas" hanging above our front door, knowing that, 2000 years later, Temple Sinai is a place where happiness dwells.

Have you really seen our Ark doors in the Sanctuary?

I wonder how many of you have had the opportunity to take a close look at the tapestry on the ark doors in our sanctuary. Have you

noticed that they are hand woven and an incredible piece of Jewish art? The ark is made up of four separate panels and from left to right they take us on a seven-day journey of the story of Creation. There are Hebrew letters, birds, lions, insects, an owl, a vision of a mountain, light and dark images and so much more all woven into these panels.

The story behind ark tapestry begins in 1969 when Temple Sinai congregant Lucille Janis noticed that the ark was covered with a shower curtain and she wondered why. According to the book, The Temple Sinai Ark Tapestry, A Masterwork in American Jewish Folk Art, little did Lucille know that question would lead not only to an incredible

creation for our sanctuary, but to a lifelong friendship of several women (Lucille Janus, Phyllis Peckar Clamage, Veronica Roth, Florence Faerman Suerig, and Ida Janus) who spent five years creating this work of

It is so hard for me to comprehend the vision that these women saw when they took on this project which started off as an 11 x 14 drawing that showed a ball of sun, a tree of life with water and fish created by Marthe Clamage, an art teacher at Stamford High. From this drawing, the will of these women, and \$500 for sewing supplies the work begun. They then spent five years stitching and sewing to create what we now have as a major focal point in our sanctuary.

Rabbi Eugene B. Borowitz z"l and Beth Levine, with Judith Katz and Laura Kruger created the book, \*The Temple Sinai Ark Tapestry, A Masterwork in American Jewish Folk Art. It is a wonderful history of the ark



tapestry. It details the lives of the women involved and their story of how the tapestry came to be. It also gives you a "tour" through the tapestry explaining the various symbolisms.



#### **NEWS FROM BROTHERHOOD**



#### BROTHERHOOD RE-IMAGINED AND RE-ENERGIZED

In a column last year, we pleaded that "Brotherhood Needs a Coup." In our last column, we reported that

a revitalization was well under way. I am happy to report that Brotherhood has completed a thorough overhaul of its organizational structure in a manner more akin to a constitutional convention than a revolution.

First, the members unanimously adopted revised bylaws. That seems rather pedestrian on its face, but the changes encourage and facilitate broader participation in managing the organization in a way that has already led to the inclusion of new leaders and, more importantly, an infusion of new ideas for social events and services to the Temple and its congregation. For the first time in over a decade, Brotherhood has a group of officers tasked with specific responsibilities and a real Board of Trustees committed to meeting periodically to ensure that Brotherhood has a full calendar of events and fulfills its responsibilities to provide services to the temple. I was elected to serve one more term as President; Glenn Harper, Patrick Kramer and Aaron Levenson were elected Vice Presidents; Larry Cryer was elected Secretary; Adam Terr was re-elected as Treasurer and as Brotherhood's representative on the Temple Board; and Gary Gepner and Jeff Pardo were elected as Trustees. Glenn

was elected First Vice President, who will succeed me as president in July 2024, and the Board assigned him responsibility for Membership. Patrick was assigned responsibility for Programming, and Aaron was assigned responsibility for Temple Services. Former co-president Marc Bennett remains active and on the Board as the Immediate Past President.

The infusion of new leaders had an immediate impact on the energy and mission of the organization. After organizing and effecting the Mitzvah Day barbecue, Brotherhood members rewarded themselves for their hard work with their own barbecue, taking the opportunity to informally socialize among ourselves. We planned a new member dinner and are already planning a full schedule for next year. Among new activities we're contemplating are a field day with parent-child athletic events and cocktail receptions preceding Summer outdoor Shabbat services.

Brotherhood has restored the tradition of having its members present the Tanakh to B'nai Mitzvah celebrants. We continue to strengthen our relationship with Sisterhood. Sisterhood and Brotherhood members worked side by side once again at the Mitzvah Day BBQ, and Brotherhood will coordinate B'nai Mitzvah presentations with Sisterhood's presentations of the Kiddush Cup.

Temple Sinai needs a strong Brotherhood to continue to provide its current level of services to congregants that

allows Growth to Happen Here, such as sponsoring the Political Brunch, the Mitzvah Day and Welcome Back Smokin' BBQs, constructing our sukkah, organizing volunteers to assist with holiday events such as the Religious School Holiday Party and High Holy Day onegs, and providing ushers for High Holiday services. Starting in 2024, Brotherhood will also have significant responsibility for programming at the Men's Retreats. Brotherhood cannot fully meet its portion of that mission solely through the efforts of even its newly expanded cadre of officers and trustees. It needs volunteer efforts by its members, and there is plenty of room for existing - and new - Brotherhood members to take leadership roles by serving on committees managed by the Vice Presidents and by managing specific events. Our members not only get a real sense of accomplishment after performing those volunteer services for the congregation, we have a lot of fun doing them.

I close by imploring existing Brotherhood members who have not been active to get more active next year, and by encouraging eligible Temple members who have not previously joined Brotherhood to do so.

#### SUMMARY OF THE CLIMATE ACTION WORKSHOP ON MITZVAH DAY AT TEMPLE SINAI

We know there is a climate crisis. But what can we, as individuals and families, do that will make much of an impact?

One area that we can explore and act on is our finances – where we bank, what credit cards we use, and how we invest the money we have saved.

There is a broad movement across Jewish organizations (led by Dayenu, Shalom Center, and the Jewish Climate Leadership Coalition) to look at how our money is bankrolling the climate crisis.

The big banks (like JP Morgan Chase, Citi, Wells Fargo, and Bank of America) fund fossil fuel companies to do fossil fuel extraction. In 2022, the 60 largest banks provided \$673 billion in fossil fuel financing.

The good news is that a number of new companies and products exist that provide greener choices. We can move our money to "green" banks that, as policy, do not engage in funding fossil fuel companies. Same thing with credit cards. And research over the last 20+ years has shown that a composite index of green companies performed as well as if not slightly better than, the S&P 500.



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
