



PHOTOGRAPHIC AND VIDEO IMAGES GUIDELINES

Temple Sinai uses photographs and videos taken at its various activities, events, and programs in temple-produced materials including, but not limited to, bulletins, posters, brochures, newsletters, other printed materials, audio/visual presentations, the Temple web site, and Facebook and/or other social media pages. We do this to enhance the quality of information that we provide to our members, visitors, and our community, as well as to celebrate faith, community connection, and fun shared by the congregation and visitors who attend Sinai activities. Pictures give visitors a good idea of what we have to offer and what to expect when they attend our congregation.

However, Temple Sinai recognizes that privacy and security are also important. The following guidelines have been adopted as a way of balancing the goal of providing quality information to our community with the concerns of privacy and security:

- ✧ Photos may be taken of people at Temple Sinai, in public spaces, and/or at public events.
- ✧ At any event, an individual who does not wish to be photographed is free to approach photographers of the event and make that request.
- ✧ We will not knowingly post anything that, in our opinion, would be embarrassing, objectionable or hurtful to anyone in the photo.
- ✧ We do not identify children or youth by name in the photos we post online. Adults may occasionally be identified only if prior permission is given.
- ✧ We will gladly remove any photo upon request. If you see a photo that includes you or your child and would like it removed from the site, please call the Temple Office at (203) 322-1649 or send written notification to shelly@templesinaistamford.org with the details.
- ✧ Photographs and videos may be taken from time to time in our Religious School. Parents who wish to have their child excluded from these photographs or videos should complete a form made available by our Religious School staff.
