

RABBI'S MESSAGE

Not Normal

Do you remember what “normal” looks and feels like? Would you like to “get back to normal” as the post-covid catchphrase goes? On first blush yes; who doesn’t want to be “normal?” On further reflection, perhaps not, for a couple of reasons.

Memory is highly selective, and we remember what we want to remember. (I almost wrote “what we want and need to remember...” but then caught myself: I for one don’t remember everything I need to!) If we think back to pre-pandemic times, we might recall those times fondly as much more carefree, before the advent of vaccines, lockdowns, supply-chain problems, inflation, distancing, masking, and isolation. But those times had their challenges too; just in 2019 there were scandals, crises, fires, disasters, and a whole host of other anxiety-provoking events. They may seem paltry from the point of view of the covid era, but at the time we had plenty to worry about.

Another reason we shouldn’t be eager to go “back to normal” is that we shouldn’t go “back” to anything. We should always be moving

forward, moving ahead. Some of that moving ahead will feel like the “normal” that we remember from the good old days. Our shul is back up and running on all its cylinders: Our daily minyan is solid, our shabbat minyanim are joyous and well-attended. The kiddush is hot, and the herring is schmaltz. The company is good, and there is plenty to talk about when we see each other.

Now it’s true, we still have optional/recommended masking during services. The vast majority are still wearing masks, and those few who choose not to are welcome as well. There is still some anxiety, although updated vaccines are supposed to be available within the coming weeks.

So all is not as it ever was—but I must say it seems like participation in our minyanim and shiurim is close to pre-covid levels.

Now think of all that we learned about ourselves and our world in the last two and a half years. Think of the new skills we learned, whether they were technological, psychological, or culinary. (Sourdough, anyone?) Think of how this experience, some of it shared and much of it private and internal, made us wiser, more empathetic, more focused people.

Think of how the trials and tribulations of the past 30 months have tested us, and raised us to new levels of awareness of ourselves and those around us.

Coming into the high holidays for the new year 5783, let’s appreciate what got us here. Togetherness, faith, technology, prayer, learning, support, friendships, emails, l’chaim online, community. Reserves of strength and endurance that we didn’t know we had. Internet skills we once dreamed of that became our daily reality. Perspective and resilience that did not allow us to feel defeated, even in the gloomiest of times.

Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur and Sukkot are times of renewal, cleansing, purification, and joy. Let’s allow ourselves to experience the full range of emotions and feelings. We’re better than we were a year ago or two years ago or three—let’s thank G-d for life, for health, and for the gift of seeing a new year dawn before us.

Sharona and I and our family wish you and yours a happy, healthy, and sweet new year.

High Holidays at Kehillat Shaarei Torah 5783/2022

We are looking forward to welcoming the New Year together and enjoying its blessings of abundant health and peace. While we are still in the shadow of Covid-19 variants, we hope to make High Holiday services at Kehillat Shaarei Torah both as welcoming and joyous as they can possibly be, while taking appropriate measures to safeguard everyone's health and safety as best we can. Please note the following features of this year's services:

--We strongly encourage everyone joining us for in-person services to obtain current vaccinations.

--Masking will be optional and highly recommended while in the sanctuary, as per provincial and city recommendations. Hand sanitizer will be available, and everyone is reminded to bring their own Koren Machzor.

--One membership card will be provided for each KST member, which will be required for admission to all Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur services.

--We will have one service in the main sanctuary. Currently the seating is arranged to allow family members to sit together. We anticipate having enough seating for all those expected to attend, although not everyone will be 2m distant from everyone else

--We look forward to welcoming our high holiday team of Chazzan Pesach Goldman, Chazzan Chaim Uri Sapirman. Our Scholar in Residence Rabbi Dr. Dovid Bashevkin, will join us for Yom Kippur. Our prayer and discussion leaders will not be required to mask while leading, and we will retain the transparent 3-sided barrier on the bima.

--We will offer individuals *aliyos* to the Torah and welcome *olim* to stand next to the reader or behind the barrier as they choose; and we will fully understand if someone prefers to decline an *aliyah*.

--We will return to a fuller service closer to pre-covid time frames; and we invite everyone to be present in person for the length of time that you find comfortable and meaningful. We plan to offer a minimal shofar service in the course of both days of Rosh Hashana after the regular services. All High Holiday services will be in-person live at KST; we will not be streaming or broadcasting any of our High Holiday events, although some of our classes remain on zoom or hybrid zoom/in-person.


--We hope that everyone will be able to enjoy and feel inspired by the high holidays to the fullest amount possible!

Dear Members:

Re: Revision of Cemetery Headstone Guidelines

As discussed at the AGM held on December 28, 2020, the synagogue has been dealing with concerns related to the installation of a double headstone when the first spouse passes. The issue is that we now have some double headstones where the surviving spouse is no longer a member of the synagogue or living in Toronto.

Discussions have been held with Pardes Shalom with respect to their rules and regulations and with respect to how other synagogues deal with this issue. The result of these discussions is that moving forward, we can only allow a single headstone to be erected. When the second spouse passes, a double foundation can be placed or a double headstone, should that be desired. Our policy has always been we do not pre-sell plots or provide guaranteed reservations. The reservation of the adjacent burial plot will continue to be done on a good-faith basis only, to conform with our rules and existing provincial legislation. Any existing double headstones, either procured prior or in place as of September 1st, 2021 will be grandfathered. Burial rights are provided to members in good standing who have paid their building fund.

Any questions or concerns regarding this change to the cemetery headstone guidelines should be directed to the Membership and Burial committee.


