

RABBI SPECTOR SPECULATES

WILL YOU COME SHABBAT WITH US?

When I was a little kid, my synagogue's rabbi possessed many wonderful qualities; however, he believed that Shabbat services were no place for children. As a result, I do not have any memories of ever attending a Shabbat service before the age of 10. My synagogue then got a new rabbi, who has been my rabbi for my entire life since then.

He took a different approach than his predecessor. He adamantly believed and promoted the idea that services were the exact place for children to be. After all, it is at services that children learn about their Jewish heritage, get to know their clergy and their community, practice what was taught to them at religious school, and spend quality time with their family without a screen in front of them. It is also an opportunity for parents to model Jewish worship and communal participation to their children and can lead to great family discussions after the service is over.

We know that sometimes even the best of us can lose a bit of focus during the services. Last year, my family and I went to Charleston, South Carolina and visited their historic synagogue, and, I'll admit, my kid (yes, the rabbi's kid), started to get squirmy and fussy and I felt self-conscious that maybe our family was being disruptive. That was when the usher came up to us, and though I was half expecting him to ask us to step outside, he instead had a big smile on his face and reached out and handed my daughter a tote bag that said

"Wiggle Bag" on it. It was full of toys and books for her to play with to keep her entertained while Jill and I got to listen and give our kids the experience of being in a synagogue.

Inspired by this experience, our staff has created our own "Wiggle Bags" at Kol Ami, and also the Shalom Station. The Shalom Station makes our services more accessible with hearing devices, reading glasses, large print prayerbooks, more transliterations, and also fidget spinners for those who need to keep their hands busy.

Who exactly is Shabbat for? All of us! Rabbi Spector speculates that attending a service once in a while will not only enhance your lives, as well as your children's Jewish identities, but also enhance your community. Will you come Shabbat with us?

STANDING STRONG AND PROUD

When you arrive at Congregation Kol Ami you will now see our newly installed flag poles next to our Congregation Kol Ami sign. On these three flag poles we have raised the flags of the United States, Israel, and the State of Utah. These flags demonstrate our pride and support for the countries and state where we live and thrive. Why put the flags up, especially now with the recent rise in antisemitism? It is important to Rabbi Spector and our community to demonstrate that we our proud of who we are. We are proud Zionist Jews, proud Americans, and proud Utahns.

Throughout our history we have been told to assimilate, to lose our identity or we would be persecuted and killed. Some may feel that the flags will call attention to us and could attract those who may want to threaten us, but we will not be intimidated, and we will stand up for who we are and what we believe in. The poles will also serve as a security barrier from anyone attempting to drive into the front door.

I recently had the honor of sharing a D'var Torah on Shabbat. It was Parasha Vayikra, when Jacob wrestles with the Angel of G-d and wins, and in that moment, he transposes into Israel—meaning one who struggles with G-d but also one who G-d preserves—and we become the nation of Israel. During my D'var, I shared a scene from a favorite movie, "Cool Runnings," in which one of the characters transposes from someone who is timid to one whose line is I am pride, I am power, and I'm not going to be intimidated.

To me these flags not only represent our pride in our faith, our nations, and in a state where we are welcomed—they demonstrate to the world that Congregation Kol Ami is a place of pride and belonging and we will display this proudly.

Never again is now!

UPGRADING FOR THE FUTURE

Just a quick update on our capital improvements. The new staff office remodel is complete. In the coming months we'll be upgrading our kitchens, adding a security fence in front of the administrative parking lot, adding a security fence along the Heritage Way side of our building, upgrading our mikvah, and creating a wellness space for health groups to meet in Rabbi Wenger's old office space downstairs.

INCLUSION MATTERS

This past February, we recognized Disability Inclusion Month. We are reminded of the fundamental values of compassion, empathy, and inclusion that lie at the heart of our congregation. Congregation Kol Ami has an ongoing commitment to accessibility and inclusion, and we are proud to highlight the efforts underway to ensure that every individual, regardless of ability, can fully engage in our religious services and communal activities. Through collaborative efforts and thoughtful initiatives, we are working to remove barriers and create a more accessible and accommodating space for all. Here are some of the key initiatives and resources we have implemented:

1. Physical Accessibility: We

have conducted thorough accessibility assessments of our facilities to identify and address any physical barriers. This includes making sure our office spaces being renovated are accessible and ADA compliant to ensure that individuals with mobility challenges can navigate our space with ease.

2. Assistive Technology: To

enhance accessibility during services, we have invested in assistive listening devices, large-print prayer books, and other assistive technologies to accommodate individuals with hearing or visual impairments. We are in the process of upgrading our assistive hearing devices to include Bluetooth accessibility. Fidgets and symbol boards are now available to assist our neurodivergent members and guests during services and programs. All of these items are now conveniently available in our "Shalom Station" resource cabinet, located directly across from the entrance to our sanctuary. Centrally placed nearby with a variety of assistive items this will help to create a welcoming and inclusive environment where all members of our community can fully participate and celebrate being Jewish and avoid any embarrassment or confusion as to where to find needed items upon arrival in our building.

3. Inclusive Programming:

We are committed to offering programming and educational opportunities that are inclusive of individuals of all abilities. This includes providing alternative formats for learning materials, as well as incorporating inclusive language and practices into our services and rituals.

4. Education and Training:

We recognize that building a truly inclusive community requires ongoing education and awareness. To that end, we offer training sessions and workshops for our staff, volunteers, and congregation members to deepen their understanding of disability inclusion and learn practical strategies for fostering an inclusive environment.

5. Community Support: We are dedicated to providing support and resources for individuals and families affected by disabilities. We aim to provide support to all our members with the help of accessible materials and aids, referrals to external resources, and links to support services.

Let us reaffirm our commitment to building a community where every individual is valued, respected, and included. Together, we can continue to create a place where all members of our congregation can fully participate and find belonging.

SALE OF CHAMETZ IN PREPARATION FOR PASSOVER

We are required to remove all Chametz, "leaven," from our homes and possessions for the duration of the celebration of Passover. That is the reason why the tradition is to search for crumbs of Chametz on the eve of the holiday with a candle and a feather. On the following morning, preceding Passover, we burn this leaven, thus symbolically proclaiming our completion of an action intended to physically remove all Chametz from our possession.

In fact, with the best effort and intention we will probably overlook some scrap of Chametz, so we proceed to ritually sell all leftover leaven. Since we no longer have ownership of this leaven, if some remains in our homes, we are nevertheless not violating the law.

The laws of this sale are rather complex and require the construction of the proper instrument for effecting the transaction. Rabbi Samuel L. Spector will undertake the sale on behalf of the synagogue and any of its membership that appropriately designate him as their agent.

This is a real sale, not a mere legal fiction and is final and irrevocable. Rabbi Samuel L. Spector will, at the end of the holiday, repurchase any Chametz from the non-Jew to whom it was sold. In order for this to be a valid legal contract, the exchange of money is mandatory. Money not used for this legal transaction will be considered Tzedakah (a donation).

I/We hereby authorize Rabbi Samuel L. Spector to dispose of all Chametz in my/our possession wherever it may be, in accordance with the requirements of Jewish Law incorporated in the special contract for the sale of Chametz.



We have enjoyed some beautiful and unique programs and events the past several months.

Our Mitzvah Day was a huge success! We assembled 738 sack lunches and 100 hygiene kits for homeless Utahns, we planted 300 seedlings for Esther's Garden where we grow produce for Utahns in need, 50 scarves and 100 warm hats were made from fleece, 50 cards were written to send to some of the thousands of Israeli kids displaced by the Hamas attack of October 7, dozens of letters to Utah policy makers were written, and 22 pints of blood were donated!

Rabbi Spector moderated a therapeutic Safe Space event on March 5th, where we provided an opportunity for congregants to open up and talk about their feelings and frustrations regarding the Israel-Hamas war.

For our March Sunday Schmooze, we had the honor of hearing from Board member Faye Lincoln for a presentation titled, "The Russia-Ukraine War: Global and Israeli Energy Solutions". 

JEWISHDAY ATHECARITOL

On Jewish Day at the Capitol this year, members of Congregation Kol Ami, the National Council of Jewish Women, and Chavurah B'Yachad met with dozens of state legislators in support of two top priorities:

- 1. Ending homelessness in Utah: We supported Gov. Cox's proposal for \$193 million in funding for homelessness and housing affordability initiatives. While the Legislature did not fund this entire request, they did provide over \$50 million, including sufficient funding to open a second family shelter in Salt Lake County this year and also \$25 million for a new emergency homeless shelter with 600 to 800 beds.
- 2. **Supporting Rep. Doug Owens' HB127:** Victim Targeting Reporting to create a central reporting and tracking system for hate crimes in Utah. The bill came out of committee with a unanimous vote the very morning of Jewish Day at the Capitol, but unfortunately it never received a floor vote. We expect it will be a top priority for the Jewish community and our partners again next year.

GRAVE MATTERS

COMFORTABLE FOR ALL JEWS

Our congregation is a merged one, so our members practice many levels of observance. When Kol Ami was formed and initial discussions of kashrut were held, it was decided that we would have kosher kitchens and that all food served from those kitchens would be strictly kosher. This would ensure that any Jew who came to our synagogue would feel comfortable eating with us—from the least observant, secular Jew to the most observant Rabbi. Similarly, we operate three cemeteries, one of which is labeled "Reform" and two of which cater to more observant Jews. But we have structured our rules so that any Jewish person, from the least observant to the most observant, should feel comfortable when visiting any of the three cemeteries.

This is primarily achieved by controlling what can be displayed on our properties but also by limiting access and conduct in ways that are acceptable to all branches of Judaism. What this means is that although in B'nai Israel we allow the burial of non-Jewish spouses and their minor children, we are very clear that they are being buried in a Jewish cemetery, not a non-denominational one. Among other things, this means that: 1) clergy of a faith other than Judaism may not officiate at the cemetery; 2) we enforce rules about what symbols may be displayed on the headstone; and 3) any ritual at a burial must be Jewish. All of these requirements are laid out in our "Rules" and Regulations" document, and anyone who is uncomfortable with them would be advised to make burial arrangements elsewhere.

One problem we have is that many of those interred in our cemeteries have living relatives or friends who are not Jewish and who do not know or understand


our rules. We know that they mean well, and likely think that it is perfectly natural to bring a Christmas wreath to the cemetery to place on the grave of a loved one. While we want to be sensitive to the needs of these relatives, unfortunately when Jewish people visit the cemetery and see this perceived Christian symbol, they may be uncomfortable. For that reason, if any cemetery Trustee or one of our cemetery maintenance employees sees such an item on our grounds, they will immediately remove it. If we know who has left the item, we will notify them so that they will avoid the expense of bringing such items in the future.

One way that we do our best to ensure that any Jew who visits our cemeteries will feel comfortable with what they see is by having an approval process for the writing and artwork on our monuments. Some symbols are present in both Judaism and other religions, such as the dove, the olive branch, or a book—and of course they will be approved. But there are others, such as the fish, crescent moon, anchor, crosses of any type, and some flowers with Christian symbolism that will not be approved. For example, whereas Easter lilies are recognizable Christian symbols, the monument company can depict a different variety of lily which will be fine. The bottom line is that monuments are public displays that will be viewed by all visitors to the cemetery, not just by the family of the particular deceased. For that reason, we try our best to ensure that nothing on the monument will cause the average Jewish person any discomfort. Happily, our local monument companies are very knowledgeable so our needing to reject a design is very rare.

In addition to all that the Cemetery Association does to maintain the yiddishkeit of our cemeteries, we appreciate that our visitors generally act in a respectful manner and maintain the Jewish character and dignity of our properties. We also assume that the souls that have been entrusted to our care and their families are appreciative.
