

As we get ready to celebrate Purim, we continue to hold Israel in our hearts and minds. This year, instead of distributing mishloach manot locally to our community, we will be sending mishloach manot and helping to share the simcha with people living in Israel. There are different levels at which to donate, and we hope you will choose the one that works for you. Your donation will benefit American Friends of the IDF Rabbinate who sponsors this project with Yisrael Hatzair/National Council of Young Israel. A percentage will also benefit Bais Abe. Deadline extended; we must have your donation by Tuesday, March 12, 2024. Additionally, please note this message from Rabbi Ozarowski: This is a wonderful cause worth supporting. But please keep in mind that it does not fulfill the personal obligation to give one's own Mishloach Manot. (They have informed us that they cannot guarantee that the foods will arrive on Purim Day itself). Actual Mishloach Manot to fulfill the mitzvah should be done on Purim Day with the giving of a minimum of two ready to eat foods to another person.

Letter that was sent out on Thursday, February 29: As you are well aware, Bais Abraham Congregation embarked on a search for a new rabbi following Rabbi Silberstein's departure. A search committee, chaired by Greg Storch and co-chaired by Michael Rauchman, and composed of Judy Hoffman, Selwyn Picker, Rebecca Swartz, Nathan Waldman and Janet Weinberg, reviewed resumes, held parlor meetings with community members, conducted interviews, contacted references and arranged for candidates to be brought in for visits.

This week the search committee recommended the hiring of Rabbi Eliezer Finkelstein to the Board of Directors. The committee felt that Rabbi Finkelstein brings a high level of intelligence, compassion, and kindness to the role, and that he and his family will be wonderful assets to the congregation and larger community.

The Board of Directors accepted the recommendation of Rabbi Finkelstein and is now bringing the hiring to a congregational vote. The meeting and vote will be held on Sunday, March 10 at 9am. Please note that Daylight Savings Time begins this day as well. Join us for Shacharit at 8, followed by the meeting and light refreshments. All are invited to attend, however only members in good standing (dues current as of 12/31/23) are allowed to vote. There will be a zoom voting option for those physically unable to attend; however we ask that members make every attempt to be at the meeting in person so that a quorum is met.

Halacha Highlight

ARBA PARSHIOT (The Four Special Torah Readings), PART I

Next Monday, March 11, will be the beginning of the month of *Adar Bet* (the second month of Adar), in which Purim falls. This is followed by Nissan, the month in which Pesach falls. Related to this is the reading of the *Arba Parshiot*. Usually, on Shabbat, the reading for the last *Aliyah*, called *Maftir*, is a repetition of the last few lines of that week's Torah portion. But on two Shabbatot before Purim and on two between Purim and Pesach, we have special readings as the *Maftir*. On these four Shabbatot, two Torahs are needed, one for the weekly reading and one for the special *Maftir*. The first special *Maftir*, called *Parshat Shekalim* (Exodus 30: 11-16), will be read this Shabbat. It is about an annual tax which had to be given by the first of Nissan for maintaining the Tabernacle (and then Temple). The second special *Maftir*, called *Parshat Zachor* (Divarim 25: 17-19), is about remembering the evil done to us by the nation of Amalek. The Rabbis related this to Purim, the holiday recalling

the evil Haman, believed to be from Amalek, tried to do. Therefore, it is read on the Shabbat preceding Purim, which will be in two weeks, March 24.


