



❖ From the Rabbi's Study Rabbi David Lazar

There is no particular stipulation that the Hanukkah lights be lit in a *menorah*, or *hanukiyah*, especially designed or made for this purpose. The Talmud (*Brachot 21b*) simply states:

Our Rabbis taught: The precept of Hanukkah requires one light for every household, however, the zealous kindle a light for each member of the household; and as for the extremely zealous: the school of Shammai maintains: On the first night eight lights are lit and thereafter they are gradually reduced, but the school of Hillel maintains: On the first day, one is lit and thereafter they are progressively increased...

At that time, lights were lit individually in ceramic lamps much like this, typical of those found in the Land of Israel in late antiquity:



We know that many poor Jews in Poland and Russia lit candles on

Hanukkah in hollowed-out halved potatoes. When I was in the army, out in the field, we used spent ammo casings as candle holders.

Here is an example of how Afghani Jews observed the *mitzvah* of Hanukkah lights in the mid-20th century (*Gross Family Collection, Tel Aviv*):



Of course, Hanukkah *menorahs* can be as ornate and expensive as this one from mid-19th century Vienna (*Gross Family Collection. Tel Aviv*):



If you're interested in learning more about Hanukkah *menorahs* from around the world, join me at the Palm Springs Art Museum on Thursday, December 21st at 6:00 pm as I speak on the topic of "No Religion is an Island: Hanukkah candelabras from around the world." (See page 6).

As I mentioned, the important act is the lighting itself, of the Hanukkah lights. The Talmud goes on to state that these lights are not to be used for reading or seeing, but are intended to be gazed at in order to remember the miraculous story behind the holiday.

I would add that perhaps the most important part of lighting these physical lights is their ability to encourage us to "light up" the lives of those around us, especially those most in need. There are many ways to "light up" at this time of year in our community:

- Consider inviting others over to your home in order to light the Hanukkah candles together, especially those who live alone. Share a meal with someone new!
- 2. Attend the Temple for our annual membership meeting and Hanukkah candle lighting let your voice be heard!
- 3. Join us at the Hard Rock Hotel on Sunday, December 17, 5:00-8:00 pm for a community wide Hanukkah Party featuring the "Klezmer Juice" band be part of our community outreach!
- 4. Participate in our toy drive (at least \$10 worth, unwrapped) to be given out at Well in the Desert's Christmas dinner and join me that day, Wednesday, December 25, 11:00 am, at the Palm Springs Convention Center to help welcome and serve guests who will come in from all over Coachella Valley make a total stranger happy!
- 5. Take part in the January 23rd Riverside County Point in Time Homeless Count. This is an annual survey of the local sheltered and unsheltered homeless population, which is crucial to planning and implementing progress in this important issue. For more info:
