* From Our President's Desk Christopher Spellman

Dear Fellow Congregants,

As the new President of Temple Isaiah, I would like to introduce myself to those congregants who do not yet know me, as well as re-introduce myself to those that do.

I have served on the board for the last three years, most recently as Vice-President. I have been attending Temple Isaiah since the late 1970's with my family and you'll find me here most Saturday mornings. While I



recognize that our attendance Friday evening is much larger than Shabbat morning, I personally find the morning service more meaningful. I particularly enjoy the Torah reading with commentaries and insights that Rabbi Lazar shares with us. Through this weekly practice, I feel a real connection with my Jewish ancestors and a strong bond with our tradition.

I think that all of us share that desire to connect with our Jewish tradition and develop our spiritual identity and practice in a safe and nourishing environment. This is why we attend services, classes and lectures, social events and tikkun olam activities, and yes, this is why we pay our annual dues!

As most of you know, there has been a great deal of discussion over the last 6 months with regard to our long-term financial stability. Some are of the opinion that we must sell our building and downsize to a property more appropriate for our size now and what we expect the congregation to be in the next 5-10 years. Others feel that we have not yet exhausted all of our options that would allow us to stay put at our historic site. Thankfully, through the generosity of one of our members,

Harold Matzner, who has covered our operating deficit for the last fiscal year, we are able to utilize the next few months in order to responsibly prepare two alternative plans for our future. Two teams are simultaneously working on these proposals and we hope to have both ready by the High Holidays. At that time, we will once again call a general meeting of our membership and, soon after, make a decision.

In the meantime, there is much to do with regard to the ongoing operations of our congregation. We have a number of committees – Membership, Fundraising, Facility, Women's Auxiliary, Social Action and Prayer - that are currently reassessing our yearly goals and working towards a greater level of accountability for all who are responsible for getting the day to day work done at Temple Isaiah. Please let me know directly (cspellman126@aol.com) if you feel you'd like to contribute in one of these areas.

We have successfully increased our membership over the last 2 years, as well as attendance at services, classes and programs. Not a week goes by when at least a number of congregational events are taking place in our building – even in the summer months! But there still remains much to do. I know that we can, and will, get this done together. We are truly blessed and I look forward to sharing that blessing in wider and wider circles in the year to come!

From the Rabbi's Study Rabbi David Lazar



This time of year, we begin to read the book of Numbers at the Torah service on Shabbat mornings. The first two chapters of Numbers tell of the census Moses takes of the tribes of Israel and describe their arrangement in the camp. The next two chapters list in great detail – far greater detail than the two previous chapters - each of the clans of the tribe of Levi, who were responsible for the duties of service and

porterage relating to the Tent of Meeting, the Tabernacle that accompanied the Children of Israel during their wanderings in the desert. In other words, these two Levite chapters with 88 verses in all, are dedicated to 96% percent of the eligible males who were counted, compared to 100 verses in the following two chapters for just 4% of those from the tribe of Levi!

One of the key words we find in these passages is the Hebrew root NS"A, having to do with carrying something, or being "carried," which in this context means to be "counted." The Levites of age appear to have "counted" more than their contemporaries in the other tribes who were the ones who actually went out to war. Perhaps this is because while war was an occasional event, the Levites were responsible for "schlepping" the Tabernacle parts, assembling these parts at each new location of encampment, and breaking down upon departure, tasks done constantly on a regular basis.

I believe the ongoing dedication of these Levites to their seemingly unglamourous task of portage earned them the detailed attention of the author/editor of the book of Numbers.

Regarding our own journey today at Temple Isaiah, we might well learn a lesson from this ancient tradition. Many among us have voiced strong opinions about the future of our congregation, yet they have not come forward to share the recent increased burden of "schlepping" - sitting on committees, raising money and overall helping out with the day to day running of our community as we face our future in a serious and responsible manner.

Whether our future lies at the historical site of Temple Isaiah or at another, smaller facility, we will always need many to share in the burden of the often thankless work of ensuring the vitality of our congregation. Please come forward and help us "schlep."
