

❖ From the Rabbi's Study Rabbi David Lazar



One of the many names in the Jewish literary tradition for Rosh Hashanah is Yom Hazikaron, Day of Remembrance. According to Talmudic thought, it is on this holiday, more than all other days of the year, that God remembers what we have done, and not done, over the last 12 months (Mishnah Rosh Hashana 1:2).

Indeed, a major part of the Rosh

Hashanah liturgy, known as zichronot, from the Hebrew "to

remember," recounts an assortment of memories based upon biblical and rabbinic tradition about God's dealings with the human race. God, according to this tradition, does not forget a thing - neither the conduct of a single individual, nor the deeds and behaviors of an entire nation. In the past, God remembered Noah and the other refugees from the great Deluge and continues to remember to keep the promise never to flood

the world again. God assures the ancestors Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (most of our tradition until the late 1960's remains relatively silent about our ancestral mothers) to foster the growth of their progeny and turn them into a great nation. God keeps that pledge and delivers their offspring from bondage in Egypt. And according to the liturgy, God can be counted upon in the future to bring salvation to Jerusalem and the people of Israel (and one might add, to all humanity). In short, the Rosh Hashanah prayer book wants us to know that while God remembers all, God can also choose to ignore some of those memories while, at the same time, pay attention to others.

Perhaps we human beings should take our cue from the Creator in this matter of memory and remembering. We surely want to remember the misdeeds of others and steer clear of those who have wronged us in the past. If we were to forget these individuals, or what they've done to us, we'd end up falling into similar situations in the future. But if we insist on neither forgetting nor forgiving, we run the risk of never improving our relationship with those same people, not to mention allowing for the possibility of their own teshuvah - repentance.

We base our religious observance upon a never-ending spiral of annual remembering. Even if some of us dispute the historicity of events, such as the Exodus from Egypt or Haman's plot to kill the Jews of Persia, these are the building blocks of our spiritual practice. They are part of our story as a nation. Yet we must also remember that slavery led to our becoming a nation with the realization that God and not another human being - is our Master. We should also recollect that as Jews — regardless of the threats against the Modern State of Israel — we do not at this time experience the volume and intensity of existential dangers we faced in the past.

As we are aware that memory and remembering are

central to each of us in building our identities and improving ourselves as people, we also know that memory is a precious gift, not to be taken for granted. One of our members, Dr. Soo Borson, Professor Emeritus in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, University of Washington School of Medicine, tells me that 1 in 9 older adults is living with Alzheimer's or a related dementia, and twice that number have milder degrees of cognitive change. Clearly, all of us know not one, but many people, around us who live with memory loss. It's not always pleasant to talk about it and in many cases is seen as a source of embarrassment. But it most certainly shouldn't be! Memory loss is part of life, every life, even if for some more than for others. It is up to us, both as individuals and as a community, to accept this and help

> create a respectful and welcoming environment for all who are affected.

It is with that in mind that we will soon begin a monthly event that will help create a respectful and welcoming space for those living with memory loss, their loved ones and care givers. On Oct. 25, 3:00-5:00, you are all invited to the Memory Cafe' for Shofar inlaid with silver, Gross coffee, tea and home-baked cookies accompanied by live music. Stay tuned for future




