Below are excerpts from our President's Yom Kippur appeal to the congregation on Kol Nidre.



I once said to a friend that our most precious commodity is time. It's not our house or cars, or the money that you donate tonight to the temple - it's time. And now, at Temple Isaiah, this is our time.

Throughout our lives most of us have attended a synagogue. And over all these years we have donated to our respective Temples. But, I ask, how many times when we donated did we **know** we were making a real difference **at that particular time**? Really think about it for a moment. If you have wondered "am I making a difference," tonight you are. Now is our time.

I am excited and encouraged to witness how our congregation is pulling together so quickly for its well being and its future. We are moving forward, coming together in large turnouts, to discuss our future. New members are joining. In a time where people are leaving synagogues, new members are coming to ours.

When I became president, my objectives were to implement accountability, organization, and unity. We are on our way. What's missing is what has been missing at our Temple for many years. We need that **war chest; a Temple Isaiah war chest!**

Much of our holiday services have been a time of reflection, but this issue is not one to reflect on. This is the one on which we must act. Your gift tonight is giving to your future, here in Palm Springs, for your Temple. And it starts now, not yesterday, not ten years ago, not 50 years ago, but now.

We **are** moving forward. Through tireless efforts of our office, our board and our committees, we are working to not just survive, but to thrive. This is a time when our religion has to exist in more than our hearts; it has to exist in our actions. And, we are doing it.

We are holding congregational forums that are bringing us together. But we need that **war chest**. What can you do? My response: "Do what you can do. And then, do a little bit more." We need to build that war chest back up. We all need to invest in the well being of this Temple. Working together we can assure our future. It's our time. We are the current caretakers of our beloved Temple. And we all need to step up!

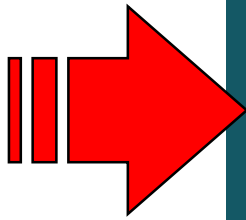

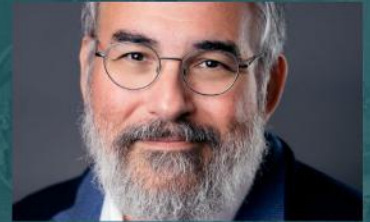

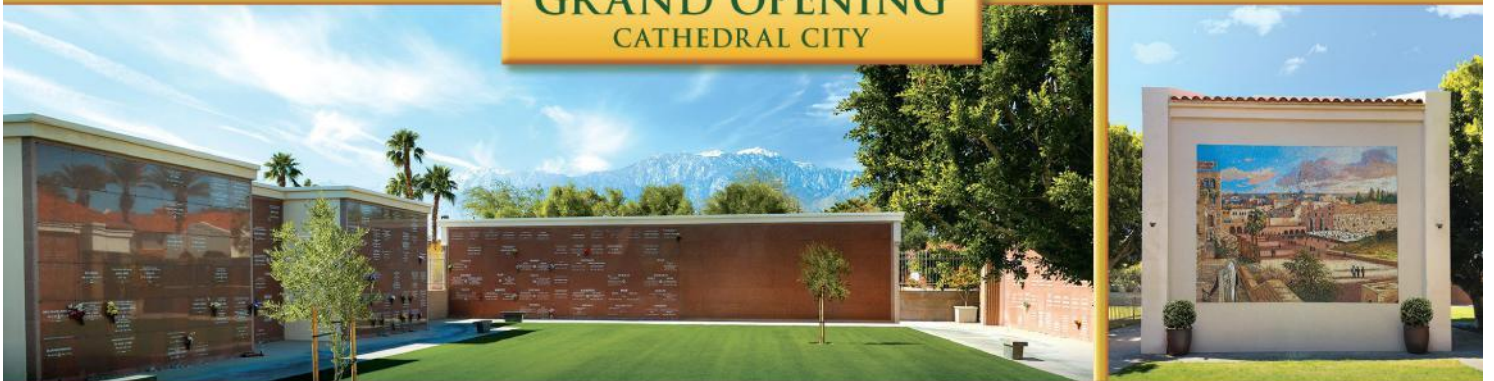
