FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



It feels like we are in a moment of deep brokenness. So many of the institutions that gave American, Israeli, and Jewish life their continuity, meaning, and flourishing have decayed, become corrupted, or disappeared. Seeing this, it is easy to fall into despair. It is hard to see anything beyond the brokenness.

Yet, by definition, breakage is required for change. In order for new things to come into being, we need to break what came before. We see this in life itself when a pregnant woman's water "breaks" before the baby is born, or when living matter breaks down in order to provide the essential nutrients for new things to grow. We see this in Jewish life when we break a glass to celebrate a new marriage, or in the mystical tradition when, during Creation, vessels of Divine Light shattered and created the reality of the world today.

My favorite piece from the Talmud tells the story of Rabbi Judah, who was deeply ill and close to death. As he lay on his bed, his disciples surrounded him. They prayed with such intensity that they were literally keeping him alive. Rabbi Judah's handmaid sees her master's suffering. She climbs to the rafters and drops a pitcher to the ground. In the moment when the pitcher shattered, the disciples stopped praying, and Rabbi Judah died. The handmaid is viewed by Jewish tradition as a righteous woman, who had the courage to break the cycle that was preventing Rabbi Judah from moving on.

There is another option than seeing only despair in the brokenness. We could see these moments as the seam between the comfortable, predictable, and broken past and the unknown future that lies ahead. America, Israel, and Judaism itself have all gone through eras of significant change before. Along with all of the obvious challenges, these moments offer us a chance, if we take it, to be part of building anew—to shape the ideas, priorities, companies, civic organizations, media, cultural institutions, and more that will make up the landscape of the future.

As we enter the High Holy Day season, can we be like Rabbi Judah's handmaid? Are we bold enough to climb to great heights and then shatter what is holding us back?
