Dvar Torah by Dr. Kasser

This week's parsha deals with the various garments worn by Kohen Gadol and regular Kohanim. The last garment described that is specific to the Kohen Gadol is the tzitz. Unlike the other garments of the Kohen Gadol, this garment is made entirely out of pure materials, a band of pure gold that rests upon the Kohen Gadol's forehead and a string of pure techeles which ties the band in place. In contrast, the Efod, Choshen Mishpat and the me'il use multiple materials for their making. Perhaps the difference in number of materials is due to their differences in purpose. The Efod and Choshen Mishpat, which contain stones upon which the names of the 12 tribes are engraved, serve as a constant zikaron to G-d of Bnei Yisrael (28:12, 29-30). Given the plurality of Bnei Yisrael, it is not surprising that these garments are made from a plurality of materials. In contrast, the tzitz seems to have a focused purpose, "and it shall be on the forehead of Aharon, and he shall bear the iniquity of the holy sacrifices that are consecrated by Bnei Yisrael . . . to make them desired before G-d" (28:28).

The Talmud clarifies that the iniquity that the tzitz makes wanted by G-d is limited to tumah, primarily of the sacrifices themselves, but occasionally of the Kohen offering the sacrifice as well. Although it is a matter of debate, we pasken that the tzitz is only effective when it is worn on the forehead of the Kohen Gadol. R' Hirsch provides a beautiful explanation why the tzitz functions as it does.

Tumah is related to the base needs of man, survival and reproduction. Thus, death and reproductive byproducts are the primary sources of tumah. It is man's purpose to use their free will to elevate themselves above their physical drives and needs and to live a life focused upon servitude to G-d. The

gold band of the tzitz was engraved with the phrase "Kadosh leHashem," reserved for G-d. This statement counters the forces of tumah and asserts that, although there may have temporary lack concentration, we remain singularly dedicated to our elevated purpose. The tzitz is made from pure materials to reflect this purity of purpose and direction. It is similarly made of the most elevated materials, gold and techelet. This explains why the tzitz must be worn on the forehead of the Kohen Gadol to be effective. The Kohen Gadol embodies the entirety of the Jewish nation, and it is only when our national focus of Kadosh leHashem is placed at the front of his mind that temporary lapses of tumah can be overridden.

May we always keep the lesson of the tzitz in our thoughts!
