

HALACHA HOW TO

Thank you for your questions on the previous Halacha How To, concerning saving a chulent that is drying up. In response to your questions, I needed to actually go back and take another look at the sources, rather than having simply relied upon my memory (which is always a good idea! So thank you!). So here is that last paragraph from last time, **newly annotated in bold letters!**

What can you do if the contents of the crock pot (or standard chulent pot on a blech) are drying up? It is permissible to add water to the pot only if ALL of the following conditions pertain:

- I. The contents of the pot are fully cooked at this point. **This is still true.**
- 2. You have temporarily removed the insert from the crockpot with explicit intention to replace it promptly (and preferably still holding it in your hands) I was assuming a case in which the water source (e.g. the urn) was immovable. But if the hot water source can be moved to where the chulent is (e.g. a kettle on a blech), the water can be added directly to the chulent pot where it is. If both the chulent and the urn are immovable, it is also permissible to scoop water out from the urn and to pour it into the chulent.

Either way, whether you are returning the chulent pot to the stove top / crock pot, or whether you are adding the hot water directly the "fire" in each case needs to be covered. (This resolves the "appearance of cooking" problem that would otherwise result.) In the case of the stove top you'd need a blech, and in the case of the crock pot you'd need for the floor of the crockpot to be lined with tinfoil, and for the knob to be covered.

3. The water you pour into the pot is already above 120 degrees F (e.g. from your Shabbat urn) Rav Moshe Feinstein was lenient even in a case where the water had been over 120 degrees, but is now lower than that, just as long as the water is unmistakably over room temperature.

Next time for real: onto hot plates!
