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Important Safety and Evacuation Information In Case of an Emergency at the Tiffany Center

- 1. In case of an emergency, please listen for instructions to be announced from the bimah. The Security Coordinators will have the most up-to-date information and will communicate to the congregation how to proceed depending on the specific situation.
- 2. Remain calm. If you are asked to evacuate the building, walk quickly, but don't run.
- 3. DO NOT USE THE ELEVATORS UNLESS THE SERVICE LEADER SAYS YOU MAY.
- 4. If there is a fire, do not use the labeled rear exit, due to the kitchen and gas lines in that area.
- 5. After you leave the building, go to your car (if you drove), Providence Park, or walk quickly to the parking lot one block north (SW 14th between Morrison & Alder) so that others may exit.
- 6. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO FIND YOUR CHILDREN in childcare as they will be assembled outside in the parking lot at SW 14th between Morrison & Alder.
- 7. For updates during an evacuation, go to havurahshalom.org and check periodically by reloading the page. There will be a message at the top 15 minutes after the evacuation has begun. Please do not call staff or other leadership. It may take time to clear the building before services resume.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Out of respect for the Holidays and in consideration of others, please observe the following guidelines:

- Prayer book supply is limited, so please SHARE! As a sign of reverence, do not put prayer books on the floor.
- Please SILENCE your cell phones and pagers. Take any calls outside or in the first floor lobby.
- Do not leave backpacks, etc. unattended. Report to ushers anything that doesn't look right to you.
- Respect businesses that share the Tiffany Center: use quiet voices and use the

- stairs whenever possible.
- Respect the need for reserved seating for people with disabilities, volunteer coordinators, and their families.
- Listen for safety and security announcements from the bimah.
- In order to facilitate access to the elevators for regular Tiffany Center business, use the stairs whenever possible in traveling between floors.
- Please help us leave this space clean by picking up papers around your seat and return all prayerbooks, tallitot and kippot to the tables in the foyer.

Havurah Indoor Safety Requirements for High Holidays

The following guidelines are being followed for all indoor activities for High Holidays in the Tiffany Center and the Havurah Shalom building.

Havurah COVID Safety Guidelines

Effective 6-15-2023

Community activities and events:

- Recent COVID Symptoms Individuals experiencing the recent onset of COVID symptoms
 (fever, chills, new loss of taste or smell, congestion, cough, shortness of breath) should not participate in Havurah activities.
- Recent positive COVID test Continue to follow CDC isolation requirements with respect to isolation and masking.
- Masking is welcome and optional Except as stated below, masks are optional at Havurah activities.
 - ♦ Tested positive for COVID recently? Wear a high-quality mask and follow CDC guidelines on Removing Your Mask before removing it while at Havurah.
 - ♦ Are you unvaccinated? Masking is encouraged.
 - Masks may be requested. Other masking protocols may be requested at the discretion of those involved in planning or participating in an activity.

ACCESSIBILITY AT HAVURAH

This summer, we requested tips and insight from Havurahniks into how to make High Holiday services more accessible and comfortable. The response was enthusiastic and enlightening. Not all the requests were possible to follow through on this year, but we hope the following improvements will be a good start.

To improve air quality in our spaces, we are moving the high-end air purifiers from our building to be used at the Tiffany Center. You won't see them in the main service area because the space is too big for them to be useful; instead, we'll have them in the smaller rooms downstairs with the most traffic. A few will travel back to Havurah for Rosh Hashanah Day 2, then back to the Tiffany Center for Yom Kippur.

Speakers at the Tiffany Center will be labeled so no one is blasted away by too much sound. Look for a colorful sign when choosing a seat.

At Break Fast, food will be labeled with pertinent ingredients listed (food donors, please include this info!). There will be a table for GF, DF, vegan, etc. food. And since it's nice not to rush, we'll have chairs set around the perimeter where you can rest a bit.

The lighting in the main sanctuary at the Tiffany Center can be a bit dim for reading. Please feel invited to bring a book light! Digital versions of this book and the machzor are available to be viewed on your devices

during services, so you can control the size of the print.

We'll have closed-captioning on both Youtube and Zoom. We have worked with our sound and video technicians to improve sound quality.

These improvements are in addition to things we've been doing for a while now, like having private spaces for nursing babies and anyone who needs to eat during Yom Kippur (both on Floor 2). The signage for these will be more noticeable now. To make it easier to be dropped off and picked up, we have designated loading zones at both the Tiffany Center and Havurah (info elsewhere in this book). Family Seating is a wing of the sanctuary seating at the Tiffany Center that is close to the exits, and where families with children, people who need more flexible seating, and people with mobility difficulties are invited to sit. Ushers are available, as always, to help you find the right seating. Assistive listening devices are available from the ushers.

We hope to build on what we learned this summer and make significant improvements across the whole year, so everyone can look forward to coming to services, either online or in person, as one congregation. Please email info@havurahshalom.org with any feedback or suggestions.

Parking

Parking is a challenge near the Tiffany Center and near Havurah Shalom. We encourage you to arrive early and make a plan. The passenger drop -off and pick-up areas may help you park farther out if you drop off your party there.

Rosh Hashanah Day 2 Potluck Luncheon

Join the Havurah community in a light potluck lunch following services at our building at 825 NW 18th Avenue. We will enjoy each other's good food, schmooze, catch up with each other, meet new people, and welcome in the New Year with joy and optimism.

Family Seating

To enhance accessibility, we will once again be designating the "stage-left" area of the main seating area at the Tiffany Center as a reserved space for families with small children and those with mobility and accessibility challenges, as well as their families and companions. These seats are adjacent to an exit to allow for greater proximity to the bima and the capacity to come and go as needed. You may also feel free to move chairs into more comfortable positions for yourself, or to add additional wheelchair seating. Ask an usher for help if needed.

Food Policy for Yom Kippur

Anyone unable to fast for medical, health or other reasons is not obligated to do so. Teens are encouraged to participate in the mitzvah of fasting along with the adults. Above all, please be respectful of individual choices regarding whether or not to fast. Those who will be eating are invited to Family Snacks from 4:30 to 5:30 on Floor 2, where some light nosh will be provided.

Family Snacks for Yom Kippur

4:30 to 5:30 pm on Floor 2 on Yom Kippur, snacks will be available for children and adults not observing the fast day. We understand there are many reasons not to fast and that everyone needs fuel. Come nosh and spend a little casual time with others between services.

Nursing Space

Nursing is encouraged wherever you're comfortable at Havurah spaces. You'll also find signage on the second floor directing you to a comfortable private space, adjacent to childcare, should you wish.

Security


Security is essential to a safe holiday. At the Tiffany Center, we will have uniformed police officers and professional bag checkers. A team of volunteers will patrol the space to ensure people are following safety rules and that everything is in order. Passenger Loading

Drop-Off/Pick-Up Spaces

We know parking can be challenging, so to make things easier, we have arranged for spaces at both the Tiffany Center and Havurah where you can drop off and pick-up passengers. Please see the accompanying maps and instructions for details.

Instructions: Pull up to the curb and unload passengers on the driver's side, if at all possible, for their safety. Please vacate the spot when ready to leave space for the next people, but do not rush. Remember to check your mirrors on the right before pulling out into traffic, and keep your eyes open for people from other cars who may be in the street, as well as bicyclists and walkers.



Tiffany Center Drop-Off/Pick-Up

The drop-off area is on SW 14th, just before the intersection with SW Morrison. SW 14th is a one-way street, so plan your route accordingly.

Havurah Shalom Drop-Off/ Pick-Up

The drop-off area is in front of Havurah, on NW 18th (see map). NW 18th is a one-way street, so plan your route accordingly.

Parking Near the Tiffany Center



GUIDELINES

- * For everyone's safety, children and teens should be in services or in the rooms designated for them and NOT roaming or loitering in the stairwells, halls, elevators or basement.
- * Bring snacks for your children, as services can be lengthy. Some snacks are provided for children in childcare, and on Yom Kippur in the family snack room on the third floor.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR COOPERATION.

FREE CHILDCARE

(for ages 0-10), 2nd Floor

Child care is free for all members, with a suggested donation requested from non-members. This removes barriers and enables us to more fully realize Havurah's commitment to free High Holiday services for all!

In order to provide sufficient nanny coverage, we asked for RSVPs. Everyone who RSVPed is guaranteed a spot at childcare; walk-ins are welcome as space allows.

Havurah Shalom aims to provide a safe and nurturing childcare environment. We will have a number of stations for supervised play and activities, as well as light snacks. Children who need more to eat should bring a lunch from home. **Tips:** For very young children, please provide formula, bottles, diapers, wipes, "blankies," etc. Please label any books, games, lunches, snacks and personal belongings for easy identification.

Tikkun Olam Tzedakah Projects

This year, Havurah Shalom is sponsoring two drives for High Holidays at the Tiffany Center. The Tikkun Olam Poverty and Homelessness Committee will be collecting food donations for **Lift UP**, while our Teen Engagement Committee is collecting books for **Rose Haven**.

Rose Haven is a day shelter for that provides resources, emotional support, and community connections to women, children, and people of marginalized genders experiencing homelessness and poverty. The Havurah teens running this project are looking for novels, self-help, and art books, as well as children's books and fiction. The contact for the book drive is Tamara Lindermann, co-chair of the Teen Engagement Committee.

Lift UP, like Rose Haven, is a partner organization of the Havurah Poverty and Homelessness Committee. Lift UP's vision (liftupurbanportland.org) is a Portland where everyone has access to healthy food and opportunities to connect with others. They are having a Nut Butter Drive to collect 5,000 plastic jars of nut butter: peanut, almond, cashew, hazelnut, and alternative butter, such as without added sugar or salt. Can you help them meet their goal?

Other items in high demand by Lift UP include: rice, whole-grain pasta, and easy-to-prepare breakfast items like instant oatmeal cups and granola bars.

A Contemplative Rosh Hashanah Musaf

(Music by Barbara Slader)

[We speak in terms of three themes that are integral to Rosh Hashanah Musaf (after the Torah reading). However, extrapolating themes lends the impression that static ideas somehow have a place in contemplative prayer. In fact, each of these three is best understood *poetically*. They are fluid, evolving, and resonate differently over hundreds of years and for worshippers in a variety of contexts:]

1. Malchuyot (notions of Regnant Energy)

יברות: אָנִי רָאשׁוֹן וַאֲנִי אַחֲרוֹן וּמְבַּּלִעָדַי אֵין אֵלֹהִים

"Anee Reeshon v'Anee Acharon u-mee-bal-a-dai eyn Eloheem" (I am the first and I am the last, and besides me there's no God.)

Consider this: To be first and to be last are *distinct* ideas. To be first means to come before and be separate from all others. Being the last, on the other hand, means *comprising* or *reprising* all that has come before. One is solitary; the other, a matter of faith, is inclusive.

***In what sense do you know that you experience something unique to you, and in what sense do you know that you are feeling the heartbeat of all the universe? Can you join these two?

Consider this: The act of remembering seems a simple thing. But maybe not? To remember what has been forgotten is akin to creating the world out of nothing, restoring things that are essentially no longer. In this sense, when one *re-members* what has been forgotten – there are bound to be aspects of the *re-membering* that are new, even while there are shards of the past.

***What are you re-membering that, until very recently, seemed to be lost?

***How does it feel to make room and hold onto what you know about yourself right now that is somehow both clear AND unresolved - and OKAY?
