Recently, Congregation Habonim was the recipient of an extraordinarily generous donation from the estate of one of our late members – May Marx. This donation will allow Habonim to begin to address a number of serious issues with our charming, but aging, building.

May Marx was a vibrant presence and creative force at Habonim for many years.

If you look around the synagogue, evidence of May's exquisite artistry is everywhere. May designed the magnificent Ark, the Bimahs, the Holocaust Candelabrum, all inside the sanctuary, as well as the captivating Eitz Chaim, the Tree of Life, that graces our synagogue's lobby.

Shortly before May passed away, together with her partner Fred Rose, May was working on adding a second set of beautifully designed stained glass windows to Habonim, which now adorn Habonim's southern wall.

May Marx's life was exemplified by an untold number of acts of personal kindness and generosity. But even after her passing, May's legacy of giving continues to live on in so many ways.

EARN 7% ON YOUR MONEY...
AND HELP HABONIM

Congregation Habonim is offering you an opportunity to earn 7% on a 5 year bond. This bond will pay you interest twice a year. The minimum purchase is \$25,000. Maximum purchase is \$250,000. We are closing the bond after \$250,000 is raised.

This will be available on a first come, first serve basis. Below you will learn more about the reason for the bond offering, details of the investment, and how to invest.

Congregation Habonim has a lot to be thankful for. It has a strong membership, it has retained a smaller community feel, and its B'nai Mitzvah program is renowned for bringing real meaning to its

participants, families and their guests.

One area that is a concern at Congregation Habonim is our short term financial situation. As it turns out, our longer term financial picture is quite strong because we own our building and the two houses next door. Unfortunately, this short term strain is holding back some much needed repairs to the building and in some cases the exceptional speakers and other events that Habonim is hoping to continue to hold throughout the year.

In short, the reason for this is that the synagogue is committed for another 4 and a half years to paying off a private mortgage (current balance \$300,000) on the two houses next to Habonim. This is a mortgage at 4% interest, that was set up 5 and a half years ago on a 10 year amortization.

This means that the synagogue is paying down 10% of the principal on the mortgage on these houses every year (\$60,000 per year), a cash outlay that we cannot afford. These houses are currently worth roughly \$900,000. In hindsight, while the interest rate was wonderful, the mortgage should have been set up with a more standard amortization which would have not been as much of a drain on our cash flow.

We are left with two options:

- 1) Sell one or both of the homes to pay off the mortgage, or
- 2) Arrange, through the members, a bond issue that will help ease financial issues until the house mortgage is paid off.

It is quite possible that we will sell one or both houses, however, there remains mixed opinions on this and the process to get to a decision takes time. To be financially prudent and to retain flexibility to assess redevelopment options, we want to ensure that we can make these real estate decisions based on the future strategy of the synagogue and not based on

short term capital requirements.

As a result, we have put together this 7% bond offering:

- Total bond of \$250,000. Minimum investment is \$25,000.

This bond investment (total of \$250,000) would be secured by a first mortgage on the main Habonim building and property (worth an estimated \$2.5 million) AND a second mortgage on the two houses (with current equity of roughly \$600,000). This bond, together with the existing mortgage, represents only about 16% loan-to-value ratio (\$550,000 on \$3.4 million) !!!

7% interest, paid semi-annually.

This bond investment will begin effective April 1, 2009

Habonim would reserve the right to pay the principal back early, but would pay a 5% bonus on your original investment.

Thank You to Nathan

As many of you know, I have been President at Habonim for a number of years now. Sometimes, I think that I have done more than my share of volunteering here. And then, I think of Nathan Kahn, and I reconsider.

Nathan has been a volunteer at Habonim for 5 decades, for approximately 50 years.

Almost since the founding of Habonim, Nathan has been fixture here at Habonim. Nathan would faithfully attend each service, roll the Torahs to the right spot before each service, announce the Mi-Shebayrach's for those who were ill, read the blessings for the Bar & Bat Mitzvah students after they finished reading their portions – and take care of a whole host of other synagogue related matters, some of which only Nathan knows about.

But what's so amazing about all of this, is that Nathan did this for no other ulterior purpose. He did not expect honors or thank you's or recognition of any kind – Nathan did what he did for Habonim out of the purest motives: He has an unshakable faith in Jewish tradition and, if he saw something had to be done would just go ahead and do it.

Nathan, for many of us, your face and your voice, were the very face and the very voice of Jewish tradition. Nathan you were the bridge between the past and the future, a link to the storied history of the Jewish people, to countless centuries of Jewish values, of Jewish life and learning.

And though you are no longer active on the Bimah, your selfless example is one that will always continue to guide us and to inspire us.
