CONGREGATION HABONIM HIGH HOLIDAY SERVICES 2005

High Holiday Services will be divided into separate,

early and late, services on the first day of Rosh Hashana, on Kol Nidre and on Yom Kippur. We are doing this to provide seating for everyone without going off-site.

The times of the services will be:

Monday, October 3	Erev Rosh Hashana	8:00 pm
Tuesday, October 4	early service Rosh Hashana	8:30 am
	late service Rosh Hashana	11:00 am
	children's service	9:00 am
Wednesday, October 5	Rosh Hashana second day	10:00 am
Wednesday, October 12	early service Kol Nidre	6:00 pm
	late service Kol Nidre	8:30 pm
Thursday, October 13	early service Yom Kippur	8:30 am
	late service Yom Kippur	11:00 am
	children's service	9:00 am
	service resumes (Neilah)	5:00 pm

We suggest that families with young children select the early services, as the children's service will be held across the street only during these times. And we suggest that members who prefer our traditional service choose the late services, as there will be less time constraint, especially on Yom Kippur, when the late service will continue through the day for those who wish to stay at synagogue. There will be a short break before Neilah service.

You may now choose to attend the early or late services. We hope to accommodate members' preferences, but your early selection insures the service you prefer. We also will make tickets available to family non-members (older than 18, out of towners) and guests. You may purchase tickets now for your guests. Only members may purchase tickets, and tickets will not be sold to the public.

We will also call upon more of our members to take an active role in the services. Please indicate on the request form how you would like to participate.

Choose your service by returning the enclosed form to Congregation Habonim. Make sure you include your name, address and phone number for each ticket, and indicate children's tickets by including their age. You must state the

choice of service, early or late.

If you are requesting a ticket for a non-member (including members' children 19 years and older) please send a cheque for \$100, to Congregation Habonim (\$50 for children younger than 19), along with the above information.

DR. ARTHUR STEUERMANN

Habonim is mourning an old friend and active member of our congregation, **Dr. Arthur Steuermann**. Our heartfelt condolences go out to his wife Rae and to the whole family. Here are some remarks excerpted from the eulogy given by **Eli Rubenstein** on Friday, May 27, 2005.

Dr. Arthur Steuermann, a long standing member of Habonim, and an active board member for many years, passed away in the last week of May.

I think of all the members at Habonim, Arthur may have been one of the most, if not the most, knowledgeable person when it came to the subject of Jewish thought, ideas and history. And, in a fashion that is often all too rare, Arthur was able to combine his breadth of knowledge with an appreciation for tradition that was liberal, open minded, and non-dogmatic.

As many of you know, when I deliver sermons at Habonim, I often ask the congregation questions, as part of my delivery...

Inevitably if the question was a difficult one, the only person who would know the answer was Arthur, but he always waited until everyone else had tried to answer, before venturing an opinion. And, inevitably, after every service Arthur would hand me the study sheets from the latest weekly bible lecture given by Professor Arnold Ages at Beth Tzedec that he had just attended.

He was, indeed, the perpetual student...

In the years to come, when I put questions to the congregation, I know that we will all dearly miss Arthur's

responses and his presence.

Arthur used to say, "If I don't learn something new every day, what's the point of living?"

That's an idea that is well worth living by.

Arthur served on the board of Habonim, and chaired the synagogue's cemetery committee for many years, a function that was only recently taken over by his brother Walter. Arthur and his wife Rae were among the most consistent attendees to Habonim services, events and programs.

Arthur was the kind of person we do not see enough of at Habonim.....and his passing reminds us of the challenge before us.

Habonim will only continue to thrive as a community, if it's members follow the fine example set by the late **Dr. Arthur Steuermann**.

We extend our condolences to his family and know they will find comfort in their memories if this remarkable individual.
