FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friends,

I have been very gratified by many of your comments regarding our High Holidays this year under the direction of Rabbi Treister. He was new to us as we were to him and yet I sensed a vibrancy in the congregation during these days which I am sure will hold us in good stead in the months to come.

For many years, Habonim has been meeting for regular worship about once a month with an occasional family service or religious school service added into the mix. Services let us worship together, learn a bit together, bring in Shabbat and

holidays together and let us get to know each other as fellow members of our congregation.

Rabbi Treister felt that we could be doing more of that and following a discussion with the Board of Directors, Habonim will be adding to its current worship and study schedule. One new addition is regular study of the weekly Torah portion led by Rabbi Treister prior to our Shabbat morning services. We have begun our Torah study sessions on October 9 with Shabbat Breishit and will meet regularly each Shabbat morning from 8:45 to 9:45 . Those who wish may attend our Shabbat morning services which follow at 10:00. And of course there will be coffee and cake to help move the discussion along.

Beginning in November, Habonim will also be adding to its worship schedule. On the first Friday of each month we will be conducting Early Shabbat Services. These will begin at 6:30 pm and end no later than 7:15. The timing for these services should allow people to come directly from work to the synagogue, bring in Shabbat together and then return home for a leisurely Shabbat dinner.

As of November, our late Friday evening services will be held twice a month—on the second and fourth Fridays of each month. Our starting time will continue to be at 8:15. (Please note that the month's second late service is the fourth Friday and not the last Friday). Esther and Larry will be participating as usual in the fourth Friday's service.

These additions to our schedule will allow us to take greater advantage of our building and provide us with opportunities for greater participation in the life of our synagogue. I hope that over the course of time these additions will become permanent and a fixed part of our study and worship program. I encourage you to help make it happen for all of us.

The Holy Days are past us, and thanks are due to many members who helped. I have drawn up a list of those volunteers who contributed their services, enriching our experience.

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL

What a banner year it has been for Morton Katz.

For those who don't know Morton, he has been a Habonim member from 1976 and on its executive from 1977 to 1982. He is a practicing architect, held a professorship at U of T's Faculty of Architecture for 10 years, and is a past President of the Sculptors Society of Canada.

To cap off the year, he has just won a competition, over twenty U.S. sculptors and architects, to create a Memorial for the Nebraska State cemetery. The 200 acre cemetery was founded in 1869, with 59,000 graves including 5000 veterans (900 from the Civil war) congressmen, senators, ambassadors and with 9/11, Desert Storm and State Civil War Memorials.

The Nebraska Holocaust Memorial Committee, in their congratulatory letter, wrote: "Your approach to the design requirements and sophistication of design will give the State of Nebraska a world class Holocaust Memorial."
The monument will be dedicated in July of 2005.

Morton recently returned from London, England where one of his sculptures, "The 3 Fates II, a 15' high bronze and steel work, will be installed at the London School of Economics. In addition, he was chosen to design the WWII memorial for Harbord Collegiate in Toronto, an 18' high aluminum sculpture.
