We look at life during the High Holiday season the same way we examine an insect through a magnifying glass. We stare at it, pulling the instrument back so that the image in front of us grows and we adjust it ever so slightly, until we see the object of our desire clearly. Those were big days, the High Holidays - one sensed their majesty surrounding us. The sun shone through the stained glass windows of our synagogue and one felt as though God has made his way into our humble surroundings.

We spoke freely about our feelings, our aspirations, our strengths and weaknesses. The human condition flourished so that conversation was rich, detailed, significant and meaningful.

During Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur and the days that follow, the world in which we live seems to grow. We seem to be peering down through the microscope at our life and it appears to be so much larger than we are. Those sitting next to us in shul take on a greater significance as we pray for forgiveness, for another year of life, for a better world.

The more we become aware of our existence, the more we recognize that those outside of us are asking for the same thing. We hear their voices; we watch their lips moving as they pray or meditate, or speak to another

person about their hopes.

During Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur and the days afterwards we seem to put life into perspective. Like the insect we see under the thick glass, we realize that there is so much more to our existence than just ourselves. Our eyes open widely in recognition that we are tiny specks in the context of history and the vastness of our world.

Now that the holidays are over, consider that we might just be under somebody else's magnifying glass. Some might say we are watched closely by God, others, by those we love. Perhaps it is we who are watching, staring back at ourselves - through introspection and curiosity attempting to figure out who we are, how we are doing in life, and where the next road could lead us.

Take these days seriously. Millions around the world do, as can be seen by the overflow of people in synagogues and temples everywhere. Think about where you fit in the world, and whether you are maximizing your gifts. Challenge yourself, like an ant, who carries ten times its weight. Realize that the most important outfit you can wear anytime is the one stitched with threads of decency and caring.

May you and your loved ones have a sweet, healthy and prosperous year and let us hope for peace in Israel and in the world.
