**Discussion: Disclosing the case of the Jewish missing people during the Argentinean Military Dictatorship (1976-1983)**

In Argentina - within 1976-1983 - a mass murder occurred with the killing of about 3000 members of the Jewish community, victims of the "Junta Militar". This unknown and terrible event occurred only 30 years later the defeat of Nazi Regime.

This presentation aims to analyze the reasons that led the Jewish community to be once again the victim of anti-Semitism and its most extreme expressions: persecution, kidnapping, torture and death.

My intention is to explore the causes of Argentinean anti-Semitism in the twentieth century (and the anti-Semitic myths that were sustained in the large-scale murder of Argentinian Jews), describe the main characteristics of the Jewish social actors (their religious, social, ideological and political backgrounds) and try to answer the following question: why the disappearance of a large number of Jews is unknown not only for the entire world but to the International Jewish Community. I will put special emphasis on the role of various Jewish religious leaders (Rabbi Marshall T. Mayer and Rabbi Roberto Graetz) and journalists (Herman Schiller and Jacobo Timmerman) who had an outstanding participation saving lives of members of the Argentinean Jewish Community, being part of the Jewish Movement for Human Rights.
