בָּרוּדְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר קִדְּשְׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו, וְצִוָּנוּ לַעֲסוֹק בְּדִבְרִי תוֹרָה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tzivanu laasok b'divrei Torah.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who hallows us with mitzvot, commanding us to engage with words of Torah.

Vilna Gaon (Elijah ben Solomon Zalman, 18th ce Torah Scholar) in *Ohel Yaakov*:

The first four books were heard directly from the mouth of the Holy One, Blessed is He, through the throat of Moses. Not so Deuteronomy. Israel heard the words of this Book the same way they heard the words of the prophets who came after Moses. The Holy One, Blessed is He, would speak to the prophet today and on a later day he would go and make the vision known to Israel. Accordingly, at the time the prophet spoke to the people, the word of God had already been removed from him. So, too, the Book of Deuteronomy was heard from the mouth of Moses himself.

From the end of Numbers

From Devarim1:1

These are the words that Moses addressed to all Israel on the other side of the Jordan.—Through the wilderness, in the Arabah near Suph, between Paran and Tophel, Laban, Hazeroth, and Di-zahab,

Devarim 1:5-6

On the other side of the Jordan, in the land of Moab, Moses undertook to expound this Teaching. He said: The LORD our God spoke to us at Horeb, saying: You have stayed long enough at this mountain.

Devarim 3:22

לָא תַּירָאֶוּם כִּי יְהָוָה אֱלְהֵיכֶּם הָוּא הַנִּלְחָם לְכֶם:

Do not fear them, for it is the LORD your God who will battle for you."

Mishneh Torah, Negative Mitzvot 58

That those engaged in warfare shall not fear their enemies nor be panic-stricken by them during the battle, as it is said, "....do not tremble, nor be ye terrified because of them" (Deut. 3:22; 7:21; 20:3).
