There were certain staples that I remember appearing every year at my family's Thanksgiving dinner table: there were beautiful place settings, delicious food, friends and family us that we are guests on this earth and should and, of course, a Kiddush cup. The Torah does not mention the fourth Thursday in November, and Thanksgiving is never on a Friday, but there it is every year at our table, one of the family Kiddush cups which my mother points to and says, "Should we make a Kiddush?" Because, for my mother, every festive meal has to begin with blessing wine. I will admit that more often than not my brother and I poke fun at our mother when she insists upon this addition to the American holiday. However, as I reflect on those meals and on the nature of Thanksgiving I realize that my mother was expressing her gratitude and encapsulating the spirit of the day in a way that Jews have known about for years.

I mentioned on Kol Nidre the assertion of the rabbis that "anyone who benefits from something in this world without blessing it first, it is as if they stole from God" (Babylonian Talmud, Brachot 35a) The proof of this is that the Torah asserts that "The Earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof." (Psalms 24:1) blessing, we are stealing the Lord's property. By and go get the Kiddush cup off the shelf and saying a bracha, like Hamotzi or Kiddush, we are bring it to the table. thanking God for sharing the world with us and

through our gratitude, we are allowed to eat food that is not really our own. These blessings, recited before every meal, are meant to remind be grateful for our lot.

Rituals like Kiddush or the blessings after the meal are part of instilling the value of gratitude in our very souls. Gratitude makes us happier, healthier and better people. As Cicero said: "Showing gratitude is not only the greatest of virtues, but the mother of all the others." (Pro Plancio 33:80) We know that grateful hearts are wise, kind and resilient, and we want our children to embody these attributes. As we, please God, sit down this month to in-person tables full of friends, family and food, let us also make sure to make gratitude a part of the meal. There are many ways to do this: the tried and true method of going around the table and saying something we are grateful for. We could reflect on the year and leading up to Thanksgiving, perhaps we get in touch with the people who have helped us and make sure we express our thanks in kind of a reverse Yom Kippur. Or if you cannot think of anything else, it is totally fine to fall back on the rituals of Everything belongs to God, and unless we say a gratitude known to our people for generations

The Season of Thanksgiving

It's customary to use this season as a time to reflect on the gifts you've been given - to look around at your family, your friends, your home, and give thanks for how they all enrich your life. As I examine my own life and see my husband, my daughters, my TBH-BE community, I feel blessed to be where I am, both personally and professionally.

One of the things I'm most grateful for is the opportunity I've had over the past five decades to be able to work with children in their formative years and help shape the Jewish education of future generations. In the fifty plus years I've been working with kids, I am still constantly impressed by the depth of their minds and the wonder with which they discover the world.

Twentieth-century Rabbi and theologian Abraham Joshua Heschel wrote a lot about 'radical amazement'. It's that sense of "wow" about the world, which he claimed is the root of spirituality. It's the kind of thing that people often experience in nature – on a mountaintop, when walking in the woods, when seeing the ocean. These small moments - the everyday things that we grow accustomed to and eventually take for granted - these are the things that will stop children in their tracks.

I've learned that kids are particularly adept at noticing and appreciating the seemingly mundane: Maybe it's sharing a bag of chips with a special someone. Maybe it's the flowers in a window box, the taste of water ice on your tongue, the smell of your favorite dish simmering on the stove, or finding the perfect stone to skip on the water. In this season of Thanksgiving, I wish for you to experience the small joys of life the way a child would - with radical amazement.

There are moments of radical amazement to be found right here in our community. This summer, we had a record number of people come together at the synagogue for a variety of community events, eager to meet our new Rabbi, Rabbi Witkovsky, and his family. The Rabbi quickly learned the names of an endless number of congregants and an incredible number of details about each one.

When they visited last winter, Rabbi Witkovsky left his positive mark on the seventh graders with whom he met. They experienced radical amazement when they learned that Rabbinic literature addressed something as humdrum as which shoe to put on first. I'm sure that if you ask any one of them, they will tell you what they learned from the

Rabbi. They learned the order in which one should put shoes on and then tie them, as per Jewish law. For those who don't know, the Shulchan Arukh instructs us to put our right shoe on first, leaving it untied. Then, the left shoe is put on and tied, and, finally, we tie the right one. I'd be happy to provide the Rabbinic sources, although you are welcome to ask last year's seventh graders.

Rabbi Witkovsky is, and I'm confident will continue to be, a resource for all congregants, young and old. As our spiritual guide, he will help the community as a whole explore the radically amazing moments in our lives.

I leave you with some questions on which to reflect:

| Do your children seem to experience radical amazement? What does it look like for them?

| Have you ever experienced radical amazement? When? What happened?

Can every mundane experience be turned into one of wonder? Why or why not?

| What are the challenges for you in turning a mundane experience into one of awe and wonder?

The 2022-2023 school year got off to a great start! Over 300 adults and children gathered together on September 13th for our first back-to-School Picnic in 3 years! Old friends were reunited, in some cases for the first time in years, while new friends were made at this fun filled evening! We dined on an array of salads and over 60 pizzas! A special thank you to Stacey Baer and Rachel Morgan who co-chaired this event for our Home and School Association (H.S.A.) and to Brian Hoffman who provided us with his DJ skills so we could dance and sing between slices of pizza!

In September, our children learned about Rosh Hashanah as they listened to the shofar, tasted apples and honey and learned many new stories and songs to celebrate the New Year. October brought with it the sounds, tastes and smells of the other Tishrei Holidays. We learned to say, "I'm sorry" at Yom Kippur, shook the Lulav and Etrog with Rabbi Witkovsky and danced with the Torah for Simchat Torah. Simchat Torah also means that we held our "Gift of Torah" celebration to acknowledge the beginning of our Kindergarteners' formal Jewish Education. Each of them received their very own small Torah on a Friday morning

during our Shabbat services. Parents were able to "Zoom" in and watch. These same children remember last year's kindergarteners and looked forward to this special day. Just last week they asked when they would receive their own small Torah. The word Torah means teaching, and this is what we do everyday in the ECC. We teach the stories, values and traditions found inside. The teaching of Torah starts when they are very young, from when our children hear the shofar or taste an apple. It continues as they learn about tzedakah and Jewish prayer. Our "Gift of Torah" is an acknowledgment of all they have already learned and the learning yet to come.

October also meant Back-to-School night! This was a valuable opportunity for parents to learn more about our school, curriculum and our teachers.

I feel that it has been good, great even. However, it's always amazing to strive for better.

Hearing the Shofar blasts on Rosh Hashanah reminded me that the beginning may be a blast, but not enough to carry us to the end. That initial blast, the launching, was not an end at all, but rather the beginning of a new beginning. So, as we start our year off with Sisterhood, we encourage you to find your place and make it a blast! Join us as a participant, a volunteer, or even if you need to kvetch about something. 
