If a liner is requested, or is required by the particular cemetery, I wish the liner to be placed in the grave: after the lowering of the casket - over the casket, "upside down", so that the casket sits directly on the earth, and there is no 'lid' to the liner; prior to the casket being lowered, so that the casket is within the liner; and I do; do not; want a 'lid' placed on the liner. If a 'lid' is to be used, I wish it to be lowered and placed prior to earth being placed in the grave by mourners; after earth has been placed in the grave by mourners, and after the mourners have left the grave site.
	Absent any legal requirement, I do not want; am not concerned about; an autopsy. (This is strongly discouraged in Jewish law and tradition, but permitted if required by law).
	Absent any legal requirement, I do not want; am not concerned about; embalming of the body. (This is strongly
