SELICHOT

Saturday, September 21

We will then join together for a service which concludes with the sounding of the shofar and the dressing of our Torah scrolls in their High Holy Day white covers.

There is no charge for the program, but we do ask that all families register so we can prepare.



INTERGENERATIONAL FAMILY SERVICE

We offer a meaningful, family friendly service on Yom Kippur afternoon. Regardless of age, all will be engaged through song and prayers, an inspiring story and Torah. This service is a perfect way for families to introduce some of the traditional High Holy Day prayers, themes and music to those just beginning to explore their Jewish heritage.
